Frequently Asked Questions and Answers (FAQs)

TEST DAY ARRANGEMENTS	
Q	I have not yet received my test day instructions. What do I do?
A	The test day instructions were sent by email on 14th July 2023 . Please first check your spam/junk folder. If you still cannot find the email, please log into your personal area via this link . This will let you know which session your child is sitting at. The generic instructions for each of these sessions can be found on our website via the links below: SESSION 1 SESSION 2 SESSION 3
Q	Is there parking available on the school site on the day of the tests?
A	No. Please do not stop, park or drop off in East Street or on the London Road under any circumstance. The police, and members of school staff will be patrolling the area and will move you on which could mean your child is late for the test. Please find a suitable place to park and walk to the school.
Q	What should my child wear on the test day?
A	Your child should wear something comfortable; this does not have to be school uniform. Please remember that you and your child will be waiting outside the school before registration begins so you should both dress appropriately for the weather.
Q	Can I change my session time?
A	It is not possible to change the session time.
Q	The Kendrick School test is the same day as the Slough Consortium test. Can my child test on a different day?
A	<ul style="list-style-type: none">There will be no alternative dates offered if the Kendrick School admission test day clashes with another school or consortium you may be considering. You must choose the school or consortium that you intend to apply to and that has admission arrangements that are relevant to your child. Any alternative test date will be for exceptional circumstances only and subject to documentary evidence.Please see Kendrick School designated area for September 2024 on our website via this link. Candidates who apply outside of the designated area can sit the test at Kendrick School on Saturday 16th September 2023, but it is very unlikely they would be offered a place at Kendrick School. We have not offered any places to candidates outside of the designated area since the introduction of the designated area in 2013.There will no sharing of results with any school or consortium.You cannot request the test day session time for your child

	REGISTRATION FORM
Q	Where can I find the Registration Form?
A	The link to the Registration Form can be found in your personal portal area here
Q	The date of birth and/or primary school is incorrect on my child's registration form. How can I correct this information?
A	Please do not return this registration form to Kendrick School but ensure your child brings it with her on the day of the test. All the information on the registration form is provided by the parent/carer when completing the application form. However, if there are any errors on the form please clearly amend the error on the form itself. Please note that we will update our internal records but a new registration form will not be issued. We will not acknowledge the change.
Q	Please can you send me an updated registration form?
A	Unfortunately not. Please see the information below.
Q	Can I print the registration form in black and white?
A	Yes. Black and white is fine.
Q	My child is home schooled. How do I complete the registration form?
A	If your child is home schooled, please leave the section to be completed by the primary school blank and attach a copy of your child's passport/photo ID to the registration form. This copy must be verified by an official body (doctor, teacher, medical professional, lawyer for example).
	CHANGES/AMENDMENTS TO CHILD'S DETAILS
Q	My home address has changed. How do I update you with the new address?
A	<p>If you have moved into the designated area or changed priority area, we will require documentation to confirm the move. However, at this stage of the application process we will not be reviewing change of addresses and documentation until we have received the results. You can update the address via this link and we will contact you if your child achieves the qualifying score.</p> <p>Please note we are very stringent in our checking of address changes and will require a number of documents to confirm the move. We may also ask the Local Authority to make checks on our behalf which can involve home visits.</p>
Q	My child has changed primary school. What do I do?
A	If your child's primary school is different from on the registration form, please manually make the change on the registration form (see question above). Her new school should sign the registration form if possible especially if your home address has changed.
	SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS/MEDICATION
Q	My daughter needs special arrangements for the test. Do I need to you let know?
A	Yes urgently! We need to know if your child needs special arrangements made for the test. This also includes letting us know if your child has any medical needs such as asthma or allergies. Treat the test as if your child was going on a school trip and let us know any relevant information that is important for their health and well-being.
Q	My child needs to bring medication to the test day with her and I have already advised you on the application form that this is the case.
A	If you have already told us your child needs to bring medication with her to the test, they should bring it along on the test day in a transparent bag, clearly named. The medication will stay with the child at all times.
	ITEMS TO BRING/NOT TO BRING TO THE TEST DAY
Q	Can my child bring a watch with her to the test?
A	<p>No. Your child cannot bring the following items to the test:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A large bag. All the items should be brought in a clear plastic bag • Dictionaries, rulers, calculators, scrap paper, protractors, stop watches, any electronic devices, or study notes. • Wrist watches/digital watches must NOT be worn. Clocks are clearly displayed in all of the exam rooms.

Q	Can my child bring her mobile phone with her?
A	No. Mobile phones must NOT be brought into the examination room. There is no provision for mobile phones to be looked after by a member of staff whilst the examinations are taking place.
	WIDENING HORIZONS
Q	What is the Widening Horizons Initiative?
A	<p>Students who are in receipt of pupil premium/service premium or is a child in care or previously in care have been invited to take part in familiarisation sessions taking place at Kendrick School and are receiving a free online familiarisation resource. All these applicants have been contacted by Kendrick School.</p> <p>If your child is in receipt of free school meals, or has been in receipt of pupil premium over the last five years, is in receipt of service premium (children of UK armed forces personnel) or is a child in care or previously in care and you did not include this on your application form, please contact admissions@kendrick.reading.sch.uk as soon as possible.</p>
