National Offer Day - Frequently Asked Questions

Q	Is my daughter on the waiting list?
A	 If your daughter's score is 110.0 or above she will be on our waiting list unless you have been offered a place at your higher preference school. The waiting list consists of the ranked order of candidates (adjusted for those living within the designated area) with scores of 110.0 and above who have not been offered a place at Kendrick School. As at 1st March 2018 there are 77 candidates on the waiting list; the highest score on the waiting list is 114.03 (within designated area at time of registration).
Q	My daughter scored above 110.0 but has not been offered a place. Why?
Α	This is because the 96 places have been offered to the highest scoring candidates and ranked according to our oversubscription criteria. Your daughter may have been placed on our waiting list (please see the question above).
Q	My daughter scored over 110.0 and has not been offered a place or been placed on your waiting list. Why?
Α	This is likely to be because your Local Authority has been able to offer you a place at the school that you indicated as a higher preference.
ď	Can I change my preference and put Kendrick first?
Α	Please contact your own Local Authority.
Q	Can my daughter's position on the waiting list change?
Α	Your daughter's position on the waiting list may go up or down due to change of preference, offers and/or withdrawals.
ď	Can papers be remarked?
Α	All the entrance tests are double scanned and checked using different optical mark readers and different staff. The process is reliable and trustworthy and as a result re-marks would be unnecessary. The likelihood of any mistake being made in recording the correct test responses from the multiple choice answer sheet is negligible. However, if you do wish to have your daughter's papers re-marked, the cost of a re-mark would be £50 per paper. Please send in an email or letter with your daughter's full name, date of birth and candidate number outlining your request for a re-mark to the admissions office at Kendrick School. A remark will not give any other information other than confirmation of the standardised score.
Q	Can I appeal?
Α	If your child is not offered a place at the school of your choice, you have a right to appeal against this decision to an Independent Appeal Panel.
