Imagine a gender equal world.

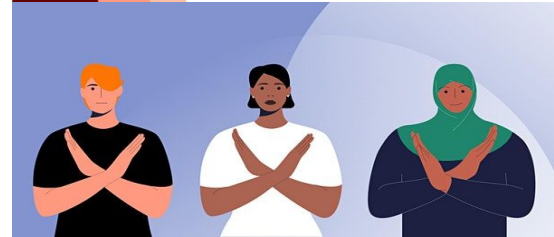
A world free of bias, stereotypes, and discrimination.

A world where difference is valued and celebrated.

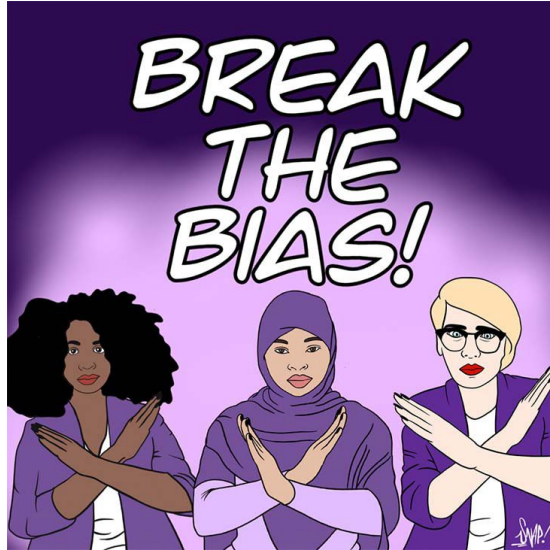
Together we can forge women's equality.

Short-term:

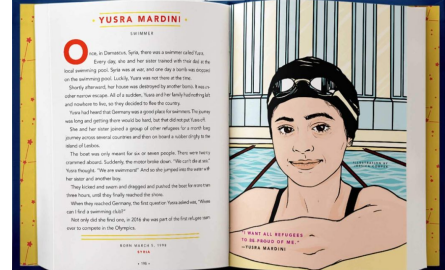
1. Use an intersectional lens; consider the minorities within the minority, are some women having it harder than others?
