Years 5/6 Rooftoppers by Katherine Rundell - Everyone tells Sophie that she was orphaned in a shipwreck - found floating in a cello case on the English Channel on her first birthday. But Sophie is convinced her mother also survived. When the Welfare Agency threatens to separate her from her guardian and send her to an orphanage, Sophie takes matters into her own hands, starting with the only clue she has - the address of a cello-maker in Paris. On the run from the authorities, Sophie finds Matteo and his network of rooftoppers - urchins who walk tightropes and live in the sky. In a race across the rooftops of Paris, will they be able to find her mother before it's too late? Hopeful, inspiring and thrilling in equal measure, this is a classic adventure story about pursuing your dreams and never ignoring a possibility.

Long Stretch – Close your eyes and be very still. You are going to do an exercise to really feel your muscles stretching and then relaxing. Start with the face. Can you open your eyes wide, and now your nose and mouth? Can you open your ears wide? Stretch your whole face as much as you can. Now stretch your neck as far as you can. And now stretch your back. Feel your whole spine stretching up. Feel your chest and tummy stretching. Stretch your arms far away from your body. Feel the muscles in your arms getting longer as you stretch. Stretch your fingers. How long can you make them? Now stretch your legs and finally your feet. Stretch your toes as far as you can. And now, when you are ready, wiggle your fingers and toes, have a big stretch and open your eyes.

If you've ever watched gymnast Simone Biles, take the floor (or the vault, balance beam, or uneven bars) for one of her impressive routines, you must have been inspired to get up and do something...anything energetic!
