Message from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

We have almost completed our two week cycle of lessons and the school, staff and students, seem to have settled back into the routine of school life. A number of students have been to see me requesting permission to pursue some social enterprise initiatives for the coming year. The Head Girl Team is underway with their plans for Fringe Week next month and have also started planning an Outreach Week for next February when they hope to engage with schools and community groups in our local area. The three Houses, Cedars, Palmer and Sidmouth have had meetings this week and their activities are underway, starting with House Football. Our Holocaust Ambassadors have planned to invite a Holocaust Survivor to come to our school to speak to the students which we hope will take place in the next two months. The Mock UN group has started its preparations for the National Conference next February. A Year 13 student is planning and putting together a school magazine to be published in December and another Year 13 student is working with me to run a homework club for refugee children in Reading. As you can see so much is going on! A full list of our clubs and societies will be sent to you in due course.

I would like to mention to everyone our **Kendrick Parents' Society (KPS).** KPS is a vital part of our school life, not least because of the dedication and commitment they have to supporting students at Kendrick. Their tireless fund raising enables the school to have items of equipment that we would not be able to purchase easily from our school budgets. Last year KPS raised in excess of £15k. £8k came from the raffle and enabled us to buy two interactive LED screens for the Geography and Economics Departments. They are donating the remainder of the money to be spent across all departments to assist in any additional items needed for the coming year. At our meeting on Monday, plans for the coming year were discussed and it was so encouraging to see so many new parents at the meeting wanting to become involved. I urge all of you to try to do what you can to support the work and or activities of KPS as everything they do benefits our students. You will hear more from KPS from the current chair, Vic Morgan and Vice Chair, Una Tietema, in due course.

We have been reminding you about school procedures and I know that messages have gone to you from Year Heads regarding specific procedures and protocols. At school we are also reminding ourselves about our procedures and practices. One area of communication I have been speaking to staff about is the use of emails. It is very easy to send emails to each other any time of the day and night. We are all trying to be more mindful of our workloads and I have asked staff to try not to email each other in the evening and night time and have suggested to them that if they need to write their email at night time that they then keep it in their draft folder and send it the next morning. May I suggest that if parents are sending individual emails to teachers that they write them when they can, but send them to us in the morning? Sometimes emails can be written in haste and after some reflection and sleep, one's messages might be framed differently. For everyone's well-being, please may I ask that emails are confined to day time hours from 7.00am- 6.00pm? Obviously if there is an emergency, please let us know at the earliest opportunity.

Finally, I introduced our new staff to you last week, this week I would like to inform you of some important roles that staff have taken on this year. Firstly, **Ms Stacey, Head of Sixth form, is also our SENDCo** and **Miss Swaine is now our Key Stage Three (KS3) Teaching and Learning Coordinator** leading the Year 8 and 9 Cohorts.

Tomorrow is our Testing Day for students hoping to join us in Year 7 in September 2019. It will be a very busy day with hundreds of prospective candidates coming here to be tested. A huge amount of planning and preparation has

already taken place for the day, and I would like to thank all our staff, the Head Girl Team and Year 11 students who will be coming into school tomorrow, giving up part of their weekend, to help run the day. Thank you.

Free Trial Music Session Available

At Kendrick School we offer a wide range of vocal and instrumental lessons, as well as theory lessons, through Berkshire Maestros and private peripatetic teachers. Some spaces have become available to learn the following instruments: piano, keyboard, flute, clarinet, saxophone, oboe, violin, viola, cello, double bass, harp, guitar, cornet, trumpet, tenor horn, trombone, euphonium, tuba and voice. If there is something that your daughter would like to learn but is not listed here, please ask and we can try to arrange for someone to come in and offer a free trial session.

Lessons take place on a weekly basis, both during school time and before/after school/at break times. These are usually on a rotating timetable so that minimal lesson time is missed. Lessons can be in small groups or individual based. Please see below information regarding fees.
