Ms Stacey and the sixth form team are now working very hard with the students and with the universities to confirm places and courses for the coming year. The vast majority of students have secured their first choice university, a few have been accepted for their insurance choice and a few are going through the clearing process. We wish them well as they prepare and plan their future courses and careers. We are so very proud of them and I hope that they too feel proud of themselves.

The new **Horizons Building** is almost complete with a completion and handover date sometime next week. The Netball/Tennis Courts have been resurfaced and look very smart. Other works have been going on at school with the caretaking and support staff working very hard on preparations for September. As I have said before we are still working on the arrangements for everyone's safe return in September and will communicate more information to you before the start of term.
