During the evening information will be given regarding GCSE options and also life and expectations in Years 10 and 11.

Your daughter will be given a Year 10 options booklet and an explanation of the process on Thursday 1st March, and it is therefore not necessary for her to attend the information evening with you.

#### Parents' Consultation Afternoon – Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at 3.45pm – 6.15pm in the School Hall.

This meeting will provide you with an opportunity to discuss option choices with subject staff and tutors, as well as reviewing your daughter's progress.

Appointments can only be made through your ParentMail account. The booking window will open on **Thursday 1st** March at 6pm and close on Thursday 8th March.

You will receive a notification through ParentMail that the booking window has opened. To be able to book appointments you must have registered your email on your ParentMail account. You can book appointments through the Kendrick School ParentMail App or by logging onto your ParentMail account. You will not be able to book appointments until the status shows as 'Accepting Bookings'.

We are unable to accept telephone bookings. However, please contact us if you are experiencing problems with booking appointments.

Please bear in mind that some staff teach a large number of students in the year group and may not be able to see all parents. If a teacher has requested to meet with you, this appointment will be made for you. However, you can amend the booking (if there is availability) or cancel it if the time is not convenient.

Ms Kattirtzi will be available, along with Ms Swaine, Head of Year 9, throughout the session to see parents and carers without appointment.

When you arrive for both meetings, please would you sign the form list in the entrance and, for safety reasons, please sign out before you leave. Also, please may we remind you that no parking is available on the school site unless you have a disability. If this is the case, then please contact Reception. We regret that we cannot be responsible for younger children as there will be no supervised facilities available.
