The plays could not have been more different from each other, each with its unique interpretation of the theme. The plays were adjudicated by Miss Fieldsend, our Head of English, who gave a most detailed and insightful critique of each play. As her assistant, I agreed with everything she said and unanimously we awarded the Drama cup this year to Sidmouth House. Congratulations to Sidmouth but also very well done to the other houses who were so very good too! Thanks also to Miss Fieldsend. I would like to invite you to the Year 7 Parents' Consultation afternoon on **Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2018** when you will have the opportunity to discuss your daughter's progress with some of her subject teachers.

Appointments can only be made through your ParentMail account. The booking window will open on **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> March at 6pm** and close on **Friday 16<sup>th</sup> March**.

You should receive a notification through ParentMail that the booking window has opened. To be able to book appointments you must have registered your email on your ParentMail account. You can book appointments through the Kendrick School ParentMail App or by logging onto your ParentMail account. You will not be able to book appointments until the status shows as 'Accepting Bookings'.

Please note that some staff teach the whole year group and therefore are unable to meet with every parent. Please use the report that you have received for your daughter to decide who you need to meet with. If a teacher has requested to meet with you, this appointment will be made in advance. You can amend (if there is availability) or cancel the appointment if the timing is not convenient.

We are unable to accept telephone bookings. However, please contact us if you are experiencing problems with booking appointments.

Your daughter is expected to accompany you to the consultation afternoon; Ms Kattirtzi and Mme Hulley will be available without appointment to see parents and carers.

When you arrive you will be asked to sign in, and, for safety, please sign out before you leave. Also, please may we remind you that no parking is available on the school site unless you have a disability. If this is the case, then please contact Reception. We regret that we cannot be responsible for younger children, so please try and make alternative arrangements for younger siblings wherever possible.
