LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers, Students and Staff

It is not often that we can see the students utilise the skills and abilities that they learn in each and every subject and put them all together to create a whole group event, but this is what happens every year when we prepare for the Inter Form Dance Competitions. Students in Years 7-11 had their **Dance Enterprise Day** on Tuesday this week when each year group was given a theme on which to base a group dance. In five hours of intensive team work, cooperation and negotiation, a group dance is choreographed and ready to be performed in a competition within the year group. On Wednesday and Thursday the competitions took place with a winning form in each year group. The winners, runners up and others will then perform at our **Evening of Dance** next **Wednesday 5th December.** Every year I am in awe of the ingenuity, creativity and determination of students to execute this activity and it is with amazement and huge pride that Tutors and staff watch their Forms perform their dances. Our PE Department, of course, do a great deal to prepare and set up this activity, but it is on the Enterprise Day itself that the students really excel and prove to themselves and us how very capable they are. I hope many parents come to our Evening of Dance next week to enjoy the enthusiasm and energy of the Inter Form Dance Competition.

Elsewhere in school, our **Head Girl Team** has led a week of **Fringe** events and activities which will continue next week. Within this fortnight of events there has been a focus on veganism, opportunities to take part in fitness workshops like Zumba and Yoga, games like 'Just A Minute', busking and a whole range of other activities. Every day at Kendrick is a fun and exciting day for students; no one can ever feel bored or not able to find something to do in their breaks and lunch times.
