WEEKLY LETTER FROM MR SIMMONDS, ACTING HEADTEACHER

At school this week we are all so pleased to finally be open to students and quickly into the swing of learning and teaching. I am happy to be able to report that the students and staff are all enjoying their lessons and being back in school. I am delighted by how quickly all the new students appear to be settling into a new routine and I have had many inspiring conversations with students in all year groups who have told me what they are doing and how they feel comfortable in school and excited to be learning new things. My observations are that the measures that have been put in place to open the school within government guidance have worked remarkably well and when there have been issues we have moved fast to rethink and re-plan. We are aware that it is sometimes hard to remember to wash or sanitise hands as the first thing we should all do on arrival but this is important and may I remind all students of this requirement. The longer lunch break is proving popular and successfully allows time for all students to access the canteen in their bubble year groups. Lunchtime clubs and activities are beginning to start up again although in a much reduced number than we are used to. More and more activities will become possible as we identify how they can safely be run. There is a new team of student House Captains and staff House Leaders who are working on adapting house events and assemblies and will shortly be organising the appointment of the student vice captains. Chicken Club has started for Year 8 and I am sure that the chickens will be brilliantly looked after as always.

There has been some congestion in the afternoons on East Street which is now easing, but please could all parents who are picking up in the afternoon consider finding a location to wait that is a short walk away from the school to avoid the congestion and to avoid parking on the pavement in East Street.

The Horizons building is being put through its paces by Year 7 and 8 and I hope that they are all enjoying the new and bright classrooms. Some rooms have been overly hot in the good weather and as there are not yet blinds or air conditioning in place I know that this has become uncomfortable at times. We are working on this but maybe some autumnal weather will cool things down and give us time to prepare for the spring and summer months.

I spoke to the whole school on Monday in an assembly and asked us all to start to look forward and emerge from the siege like state that lockdown put us all into. We should not be deterred from trying new things and taking risks with our thinking and pushing the limits of our understanding. We will take time too to reflect on the year and its impact on ourselves and those around us and work doubly hard on forming and building strong and supportive relationships in our community. School life will challenge us all to work again within a set of routines and expectations and we remember that all of these are put in place to keep us safe and promote the very best learning opportunities. Also in my assembly I discussed our personal values and the school's values which are best expressed through the school pledge:

"We the students, staff and friends of Kendrick School pledge to uphold the values of friendship, kindness and respect. We promise to stand against prejudice, ignorance and injustice in all its forms, promoting the values of equality, tolerance and justice for all".

SAFEGUARDING

TIKTOK

There is an extremely upsetting and highly graphic video currently trending on TikTok of a man live-streaming his suicide. Whilst TikTok have stated that they are doing their best to remove the video, it has been shared across many social media platforms hundreds of thousands of times including under fake captions. Some captions on TikTok are as trivial as 'look at the pasta I cooked tonight' before the video then plays; therefore children can come across the video without even searching for it.

This video is extremely distressing and parents/carers and students should avoid the app whilst this video is in such high circulation.

We urge everyone to be vigilant and ask that you supervise very closely hat your children are accessing online.

OnlyFans

OnlyFans is a social media site where users can upload videos and people can pay the creator to watch them. During lockdown signups grew rapidly. In particular, it became a 'go to' site for sex workers, unable to see clients physically, to upload explicit content.

Terms of use say that users must be 18 or over to create an account, but of course this is being ignored, by young people and, it seems, the company.

The BBC drew attention to OnlyFans in a BBC Three documentary which found underage girls selling explicit content. Vulnerable people are also at risk.

Kendrick School uses ParentMail, a service used by over 6,000 schools, nurseries and children's clubs to communicate to parents.

Student reports are sent by email using an application called SchoolComms.

HOW TO REPORT A STUDENT ABSENCE

Via ParentMail App

You can report a student absence due to illness through the ParentMail App. Please see the guidance below:

- From the ParentMail App, open 'Absences' and select the name of child who will be absent.
- Select a reason for absence from a drop down menu.
- Select an amount of time that your child is likely to be off school for.
- Add any additional notes, and then send to school.
- Please note this reporting can only be done via the ParentMail App.

Via the Unwell Student Line

If you cannot use the App, please call the school on 0118 901 5859 and leave a message on the dedicated unwell student line. In either case, please do this before 9am.

If your child is absent from school and we have not been informed we will send a message via ParentMail. We will ask you to telephone the school to give the reason for her absence.

Planned Medical Appointments

If your child is missing school for a medical appointment please send an email to admin@kendrick.reading.sch.uk giving as much notice as you can. These absences will always be authorised. Please note that students under the age of 16 **must** be collected from school by a responsible adult for appointments that take place during school hours.

Participating in Drama, Music, Sport, Events

We are happy to support students participating in drama, music, sport etc. out of school and if your child needs time off for any of these reasons please ask them to collect a form from the General Office for you to fill in. This form is passed to Ms Kattirtzi who will then send an email home to confirm.

Holiday in Term Time

We actively discourage term time holidays, but if you feel you must take your child out of school, please ask them to collect a form as above. This form is passed to the Headteacher who will look at each individual request and you will receive a response by letter or email. In most cases some or all of this absence will be recorded as **unauthorised**.

Please do not contact Form Tutors, Heads of Year or individual staff members about absences of any description.

HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

At every opportunity we stress the importance we place on the relationship between the School and the home and we do a great deal to strengthen and develop this relationship.
