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## Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

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**In this week's update to you I want to focus on the safety and safeguarding of all our students.**

At Kendrick we take the safeguarding of our students very seriously and all staff have been trained on all the recent updates and changes to the [Keeping Children Safe in Education Document](#). At our meetings with parents we stress the importance of this element of our responsibilities and always speak to students about this. If any parents have any concerns about their daughter or another student and feel that they need to share information with us, please do so. **We all have a duty of care towards our children.**

Yesterday tutors were asked to have conversations with students about **personal safety** to and from school. We have asked all students to try to make their journey to and from school with friends and or in groups. This is not always possible but we strongly urge that students make their way to the station or bus stops quickly and safely and with others. We also encourage all students to be purposeful and vigilant when walking in and around Reading and make their way home quickly. Here is [link](#) to some tips regarding personal safety that were discussed with students this week. May I also remind you that we expect parents to collect students aged under 16 from school in the event of them having to leave early for reasons such as medical appointments.

A number of students have to go into Reading to get buses or trains and so have to cross the **Inner Distribution Road (IDR)**. This is a very busy road and students often rush across the road and or follow others in front of them with little regard to the traffic signalling or cars on the road. Please may I ask parents to discuss this issue at home and rehearse sensible **pedestrian behaviour** on this road and others? We have tried on many occasions to bring up the issue of IDR crossing with Reading Borough Council and with the support of our local MP, but we are told it is a safe crossing if pedestrians, including children, follow the rules.

We have also been asked by **Thames Valley Police (TVP)** to make students and parents aware of the campaign that they are running called [Hidden Harm](#) which seeks to raise awareness and understanding of abuse happening in the heart of our communities including: modern slavery, online abuse, honour based violence, forced marriages, female genital mutilation, domestic abuse and hate crime. Issues like these are discussed in PSHCE lessons with students but TVP want all of us, in their words, to '**open our eyes to abuse**'. **Safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility.**

Another area of safety and safeguarding is related to use of **mobile phones** and there are conversations going on in different year groups and advice coming to parents on this issue.

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## SAFEGUARDING

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Brake, the road safety charity, have the following advice for young people for staying safe on foot or bicycle:

*“Look out for yourself and your friends when out on foot or bicycle. Choose the safest routes you can (which are often nicer anyway), like quieter, slower roads, with pavements if you’re walking or cycle paths if you’re going by bike.*

*It’s easy to get distracted by your phone or by friends, but you need to be alert to traffic. Put your phone away and take your earphones out when crossing the road. Don’t trust that drivers will spot you and be able to stop in time – many drivers go too fast and don’t pay enough attention, so anything you can do to protect yourself is a good thing.*
