Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Dear Parents/Carers, Students and Staff

So far this term we have had Information Evenings with parents of students in years 7, 8, 10 and 12. We had an Information Evening with Year 13 at the end of the last academic year, we will be seeing Year 11 students and their parents next month at our Sixth Form Open Evening and we will be meeting Year 9 parents in March 2019 when we introduce GCSE options to them. All these meetings are intended to develop and strengthen the partnerships we want to have with parents and students as we believe a strong and trusting partnership between us supports our students and helps them manage their school life. These events are also an opportunity for parents to meet Tutors and key staff in the year group and, of course, it is always a pleasure for me to meet parents. At the meetings we have had recently we gave some key messages to parents:
