LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Unfortunately, I am starting this week's Weekly Update with a complaint I received this morning from a local resident who is very angry about an accident that nearly happened in his private parking area yesterday. Some Kendrick parents continue to park opposite the school in Elizabeth Mews to wait for their child at the end of the school day. On this occasion a resident was returning home with his child in his car and nearly collided with one of our parents who was picking up a Kendrick student. Three cars were parked illegally in the private parking area opposite our Reception, trespassing on people's property. I have spoken before about the need for us to have good neighbourly relations which in the main we have, but yesterday's incident amounted to dangerous driving, as well as trespass. I ask again that all parents who drop off or collect their child, park well away from school. I thank all the parents who have taken on board this message and apologise to all the parents for whom this is not an issue. Sadly, the behaviour of just a few people can impact on the reputation of the whole school, which is unfair and not necessary. I will be contacting this resident personally to apologise for the behaviour of these parents and from today members of the Senior Leadership Team will be on duty outside school to prevent this from happening again.

Inside school wonderful things continue to be planned and/or are taking place. The Biology Department has had a Biology Week and enthused students about the wonders of Biology. In due course a report and photos will be compiled for you to see. Kendrick Student Leaders, working with the History Department, are planning events to raise awareness of Black History month, highlighting the work of the Historian David Olusoga. See link here.
