LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

We started the week marking World Mental Health Day. Students and staff were invited to wear something yellow (socks, headscarf, hairband) to raise awareness through #HelloYellow 2022 supported by <u>Young Minds</u>. The theme this year was 'Make mental health and wellbeing for all a global priority', an ambition we all whole heartedly support at Kendrick. Today the Student Welfare Committee of the Kendrick Student Leaders is hosting a *cookies and chat* session in The Base for students to join.

Our birthday celebrations continue as we get closer to identifying 145 significant women who lived during the period 1877-2022. Some super suggestions are being sent in of women whose activities and achievements have had an impact on our times. We intend to make a permanent display of these nominations and quotations in the library. Also, in the library is a new display of the Lionesses on our *Lead Inspire* board please see <u>here</u>. I would also like to mention that we have confirmed the date of our reunion of former students which will be on **Friday 2nd December** when we hope several past students of Kendrick will come to school to celebrate their educational experiences and reconnect with their school and friends. Also please do not forget to purchase your whole school photo, a wonderful keepsake of this occasion.

I attended an assembly for Year 9 this week on the theme of Choices. Mrs White, Assistant Head of Key Stage 3 explained to the students that the idea of choices is something that characterises this year for Year 9 students. The most obvious choices Year 9 must make later in the year are to do with their GCSE subject choice, but more than that, Mrs White talked about choices students make every day in their life. They choose to work hard, to be engaged in what they do, to be kind and caring towards each other, to be passionate about what they do, to be thoughtful and safe when they are online and messaging their friends, and to get on with each other. These are all healthy choices that we encourage them to consider every day. At the same time students in Year 13 have been making some very significant choices about their future. The UCAS application process is coming up to our internal deadline and I know many Year 13 students have been working on their choice of subject to study and university to apply to for their future studies, whist teachers have been checking applications and writing references. This is a most intense time for these students, and I know they will all breathe a sigh of relief when this stage of the process finishes next week.

Next week, the Kendrick Parents' Society AGM takes place on Monday 17th October at 6.00pm. The meeting will be remote and this is the zoom link for joining the meeting. We will have a report from Gayatri Hariharan, Chair of KPS about the activities of KPS this year, their fund raising, as well as their future plans. The officials of the committee will be elected and confirmed for the coming year, and they will once again set out their ambitious plans, not only to raise money for the school, but also to help integrate and connect parents and students in our community. The money raised by KPS is vital to the school and complements donations that parents make through our School Fund. I believe that there may be some confusion amongst parents about the voluntary funding streams that come into school, which I will speak more about next term.

Finally, I would like to thank parents who have taken on board my message from last week and are not dropping off and picking up their children outside school. We are having conversations with our neighbours to try to maintain the good relations we seek to have with people in our local community.

1 in 10 young people will go through periods of feeling emotionally unwell during any given year, but what do you do when this is your friend or relative?

We understand it can be hard to know what to do when someone you care about is going through a rough patch, so Anna Freud have put together some tips and advice, with the help of Common Room and young people from mental health support group Hearts & Minds.

This <u>link</u> will give you some information on how to talk to someone you're worried about, how to look after yourself during this time and how to seek help from an adult if you become seriously worried. In each section, you can read quotations that come directly from young people who have experience coping with similar situations. SAFEGUARDING – PERSONAL SAFETY

When you're out and about, it's important to take some sensible precautions to stay safe.

- Make travel plans in advance and let your family or friends know when and where you're going.
- Stick to busy, well-lit areas and keep close to a group if you feel unsafe.
- Book a licensed cab in advance or hail a black cab (Hackney Carriage) from the street. Only black cabs can be hailed from the street so don't try to hail a minicab without booking it in advance and never accept a lift from a stranger.
- Think about carrying a personal safety alarm with you when you're out.
- Stay alert and aware of your surroundings don't wear your headphones when you're out alone.
- Don't keep all your valuables in one place. Try to keep them in different pockets or areas of your bag.
- If you feel worried or threatened on public transport, contact the guard or the British Transport Police.
