# LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

It is the penultimate week of term and everyone is feeling very tired after seven weeks of school. In addition, illness amongst staff and students has resulted in absence and some lessons having to be covered and students doing set work. We still have one week to go before we have a week off and I hope everyone can pace themselves so that we can get there and enjoy a bit of time off.

Whatever week of term it is, Kendrick is still a very busy place with so much going on every day. So many clubs and activities that the students take part in during breaks and after school. A couple lunch times this week I have seen so many students on the courts playing netball with Miss Woods, other students in the hall practising for the concert next Thursday with Mrs Cooper and today I know that the newly formed Bridge Club is having a visitor, expert in the game, joining them. The range and variety of what is available to students is immense and available to all.

Tomorrow, 18<sup>th</sup> October, is the Kendrick Parents' Society Diwali Celebration which is taking place in the school hall from 4-7.00pm. The posters and information have been circulated many times to parents and again today, so please give some time to this event and come along. There will be display of performances by our students, and, as always, some delicious food from stall holders that have been invited to be part of the event. Finally, the Curriculum and Current Affairs Committee is putting together a Newsletter so that everyone is informed of everything that is going on. As well as providing them with fun activities to take part in, the activities allow for students across years to get to know each other. Younger students are socialising and getting to know older students, and this allows for role modelling which is such an important part of school life. Without realising it students are learning from each other, seeing behaviours that they wish to aspire to or emulate which adds to their personal development and a more rounded education.

An annual event that happens at this time of the year is Biology Week which attracts such interest amongst students. My colleagues in Biology manage this practical experiment with ease and confidence and my observation of students that go to watch and to hear the commentary associated with the process is that they are fascinated and eager to attend. # MESSAGE FROM THAMES VALLEY POLICE – KEEPING FAMILIES SAFE FROM COURIER FRAUD IN THE THAMES VALLEY

POLICE

The Independent charity Crimestoppers and Thames Valley Police are working together to stop a type of scam called courier fraud—and we need your help to protect children, parents, grandparents, and the whole community.

## What Is Courier Fraud?

Courier fraud is when a scammer pretends to be a police officer or bankworker and tricks someone into handing over money or valuables. Here's how it works:

- They call and say there's a problem with your bank account.
- They call and ask for assistance in an investigation.
- They ask for private details like your PIN or bank card.
- They tell you to take out money or buy expensive items.
- Then they send a courier or taxi to collect it.
- Once they have it—they disappear



100% anonymous. Always.

This can happen to anyone, but scammers often target older people or young people who may not know it's a trick.

## Why Families Should Talk About This

Detective Inspector Duncan Wynn from Thames Valley Police says:

"Fraudsters use pressure and fear to trick people. But by talking about it at home and in schools, we can stop these crimes before they happen."

Here's how you can help:

- Talk to your children, friends, peers and family especially grandparents about scams.
- Look out for unusual behaviour—like someone suddenly withdrawing lots of money or being secretive about phone calls.
- Encourage young people to speak up if they're approached online or in person to "help" with money transfers or deliveries.

## How Young People Can Be Involved

If something feels wrong - it probably is. Always check with a trusted adult.

#### Who Else Can be used to facilitate this crime?

Courier fraud can involve:

- Taxi drivers unknowingly picking up scam packages.
- Shops and jewellers selling high-value items to victims.
- Currency exchange bureaus used to move money.

If you work in these areas or know someone who does - please share this message.

## How to Report (Anonymously)

If you see something suspicious or know someone who might be involved, you can report it 100% anonymously:

- Call Crimestoppers free on 0800 555 111

### You can report:

- Names or descriptions of people involved
- Apps or websites used to recruit young couriers
- Suspicious behaviour in shops or taxis

## LAMDA – IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING MESSAGE

If your child attends LAMDA on a Tuesday at Kendrick School, please remind them of the following important safeguarding information:

**4PM CLASS** Students must either wait in the Horizons canteen at the end of the school day OR leave school and return at 3.55pm and go straight to the LAMDA class.

**5PM CLASS** Students must either wait in the Horizons canteen at the end of the school day until 4pm and then move to the Library until 5pm OR leave school and return at 4.50pm at the earliest and go straight to the LAMDA class.

Students are not allowed to leave the school and go to the local shops and return before those times. This is because we need to know who is in school for safeguarding and health and safety purposes.

We would strongly recommend that students attending LAMDA classes stay in the school for their own safety and wellbeing. Students are allowed to bring a snack and eat this in the Horizons canteen at 3.30pm supervised by LAMDA staff.

Therefore, please ensure that you are aware of your child's whereabouts between the end of the school day and attending their LAMDA class. LAMDA is not a Kendrick School initiative and therefore the attendance and safeguarding of participants is the responsibility of LAMDA. We are happy to supervise the students in school until they attend the LAMDA class, however, if they leave the school, the responsibility is on the parent to ensure they know where their child is.

### PARKING - PLFASF RFAD

Please be reminded that there is no parking or stopping anywhere on East Street. This includes the flats opposite the school which is private parking only, including the drive up to the parking area. The residents are becoming very irritated and upset by parents parking here and are now considering taking more serious action, which could include clamping. Please be considerate of our neighbours and also the safety of the students. Please do not stop along East Street for your child to get out of the car. This is extremely dangerous for the child getting out of the car and also holds up the traffic. Please find somewhere safe and legal to drop off and collect your child away from East Street and the London Road.
