# Weekly Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

It has been a pleasure to meet parents of Years 7, 8, 10 and 12 in the last few weeks since the start of this term. The purpose of these Information Evenings is to enable staff and parents to get to know each other a little better and for parents to have an insight into what is going on in school and how students' education is being planned over the next two years. It is also an opportunity to explain to parents some of the key values and culture we are trying to develop with students whist they are with us at Kendrick. In all the meetings we have outlined the academic pathway for students but we have also emphasised the need to nurture and support our students to grow into capable, independent and responsible individuals who care about each other, their community and themselves. I hope parents who have been to the meetings recently feel they are a bit more familiar with life at school and the experiences their children have every day.

As well as meeting parents, Mr Simmonds and I are meeting all Year 12 students to talk to them about how they are finding the Sixth Form. Most of the students I have spoken to feel that they really like the Sixth Form as they are able to study subjects of their choice and leave behind others. They all spoke about the greater independence and self-discipline required for A Level studies and how in some subjects the step up to A Level is quite significant. By half term I will have seen all of Year 7 students to ask them how they are liking life at Kendrick; I am very much looking forward to speaking to them.

School life has been busy again this week: **Biology Week** has attracted students to the Biology Labs but also out into the grounds to identify trees and plants, there have been forensic investigations to try to find Mrs Kenward's marker pen and today there will be a dissection of a sheep's head! The enthusiasm of the students is great to see and I am grateful to the Biology Department for putting on such a series of events to engage students in this subject.

Yesterday was **Mental Health Awareness Day** and when I went to assembly with Years 7, 8, 9, there was a sea of yellow as many students wore an item of yellow clothing as part of the Young Minds charity initiative. There was a 'chalk- ing' where students wrote positive and encouraging messages in chalk on the concrete area outside the Main School, reminding everyone to value kindness, appreciation of others and other positive behaviours that can make people feel happier about life. These messages are so important to remind all of us to keep working on our own mental health and wellbeing. I believe there was also quite a lot of cake consumption taking place as well which can often brighten our mood!

Year 8 had a super day on Tuesday when the company **VISA** came into school and worked with them on a Work Related Learning activity where they had to devise an app. The winning team came up with an app that helps you decide what to wear every day depending on the weather, what you have in your wardrobe and what you haven't worn for some time – genius! This day is one of many that make up our **Work Related Learning Programme** organised and led by Mrs Rock where all year groups have some kind of activity suited to their age that promotes and provides guidance for careers and future plans. Today Year 11 will begin 20 minute one to one interviews with a qualified Careers Officer about their plans for the future as they prepare to consider what they want to do post 16. This will be followed in Term 2 with the **Design Your Future** event (7/11/19) and after that their **Post 16 Conference** (12/11/19) and **Sixth Form Open Evening** (14/11/19) leading to them starting to consider A Level Options in December and future plans.

Unfortunately I have had to speak to all students this week about the behaviour of some individuals at bus stops and on certain bus routes following two complaints I received at the start of the week. I know the behaviour reported to me is that of a very tiny minority of the students, possibly two or three. However, this is not how the general public who see such behaviour see it. What they see is a small group of students behaving badly and leap to the assumption the whole school is like this. This is how reputations get damaged unfairly. I have spoken to all students in Year 7-11 and reminded them that at all times I expect them to be ambassadors of our school wherever they may be and especially when they are in uniform. Please may I ask parents to support us in reminding students of this important responsibility they have being members of Kendrick School.

We finish this week with a super event: **Dr Shola Mos Shogbaminu's** talk to students this afternoon at 3.30pm in the Hall. I am sure listening to Dr Shola will send us home this weekend inspired and ready to improve the world! Then next week we have our **Diwali** event to look forward to as well!

## **Sixth Form**

#### Sixth Form Deposit and Bursary

Further to the information provided in the Sixth Form Handbook issued on Registration Day we write to advise that the Sixth Form Deposit is now live to pay on ParentPay and kindly request that it is paid by Friday 25th October. Although some departments may ask students to purchase books, we ask for a Sixth Form deposit of £50 from all students to set against loss or damage of books issued through the Library or additional resources produced by departments, and against the cost of replacing lost and unreturned locker keys and/or school entry fobs and lanyards.

This sum is returned on request at the end of their Sixth Form career provided all resources and items have been returned to the school and once departments and the Library have had the chance to try to reclaim money for lost

books and resources, usually in October. Alternatively, the Sixth Form Deposit may be donated to the School Fund account where it will be used to improve facilities in the school. If the Sixth Form Deposit is not reclaimed a year after leaving school, the sum will be transferred to the School Fund account as a donation.

As a reminder, we wish to draw your attention to the availability of the 16-19 Bursary Fund, which provides eligible students with some funds to help with the cost of transport, food and educational resources. Further details and the eligibility criteria can be found on our website under the Sixth Form information. The deadline to submit Bursary applications is Monday 7th October 2019. ## Year 10 Work Experience Placement

We are delighted to be offering a Work Experience Placement (WEX) opportunity to all our Year 10 students. This provision is in line with government guidance for the delivery of a good Careers Education Information Advice and Guidance Programme (CEAIG).

**Purpose**: WEX placements at this stage is predominantly about providing an opportunity to test and develop their 'transferable skills' in an unfamiliar, yet professional situation. By these skills we mean: communication, problem-solving, showing initiative, teamwork, organisation etc.

**Process:** Kendrick School is working with 'Learning to Work', who will support the delivery of this programme. They will have a conversation with each of our students to enable the best fit of placements possible. They will source placements for students who have not been able to source their 'own placement'. All placements are vetted for Health and Safety for insurance purposes.

**Payment:** The price for this service is £60 per student and we value and appreciate you financial support for this initiative. Parentpay is now set up.

#### Time line:

- Launch concept to parents: October 2019 (Year 10 Information evening)
- Parentpay: On our system from 2nd October 2019
- Launch WEX programme to Year 10s: January 2020 (Assembly)
- One-to-one conversations with 'Learning to Work', from early February 2020
- Application process: All General (BLUE) forms to be returned 14<sup>th</sup> February 2020
- Application process: All Own Placement forms (PINK) to be returned by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020
- Work Experience Week: 29th June 3rd July 2020

**Request for further support:** Kendrick School enjoys the supportive relationship of parents/carers. If you think you could help us by providing a WEX placement for one or more of our students or if you can support us in any other way, we would be delighted to hear from you.
