### WEEKLY LETTER FROM MR SIMMONDS, ACTING HEADTEACHER

We are now at the end of our third week of teaching and I am delighted to be able to report that the school is continuing to run smoothly. Routines that at first were very strange are now beginning to become familiar and have only a small impact on our learning. I have recorded a <u>short assembly</u> for all the school thanking students and staff for the way that everyone has pulled together and on the success of our safety procedures as well as giving messages that we must still be conscious of the distance that we give each other when moving around the site. Government guidance strongly emphasises that the most important thing for us all to do is remain vigilant, be aware of those around us, follow the rules and wash hands regularly. The 'Word of the Week' this week in school is 'mitigate', a verb meaning to make (something) less severe, serious or painful and I certainly feel that we are effectively mitigating the impact of COVOD 19 on the students' learning. Guided by their teachers, they continue to study hard, know more and remember more.

Two year 13 students, Abby and Mo Li have been leading auditions for students in Years 8-12 this week as part of the student-led production of 'As You Like It' for Shakespeare Schools Festival 2020. This production is part of a world record-breaking attempt for the most amount of people simultaneously performing Shakespeare in one evening. Coincidentally I popped into a Year 9 lesson earlier this week to see them discussing a scene from Romeo and Juliet and I was struck by their knowledge, analytical skills and their appreciation of the writing at such a young age. We are all excited to watch as this project develops.

I was able to congratulate the Physics department again this week, this time for the extraordinary achievements of 40 year 11 students last year in the Physics Olympiad Competition. They gained 16 wards including a Gold award for Elli which I was able to present at a meeting of Engineering Society.

School Council has me this week and will continue to meet and work throughout the year and I look forward to giving updates on their plans for the year.

I am sorry that our welcome and information events for parents have all had to go online and that we have not been able to invite parents in for a chat and look around the new Horizons building, but I very much hope that you enjoy and value watching the recorded messages that will made available early next week for each year group alongside the virtual tour of the building.

Finally this week there are three vacancies currently being advertised on our website for a Student Welfare and Attendance Officer, Chemistry Technician and Outreach and Admissions Assistant; please point these out to someone you know who may be interested in one of these roles.
