## Message from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Yesterday's profiling and discussion of reports went well for students and staff. Thank you to everyone for their time and preparation for what is a huge school activity. One to one conversations with students enable staff and students to have good learning conversations to discuss progress so far this year, as well as, identify areas for development for the next few months and year. It is also an opportunity for teachers to commend and congratulate students on their achievements so far. Whist profiling was going on, a number of activities were organised for the students, in particular, the Enterprise Day for Year 10 students. Students were asked to work in teams to create a board game for younger students which this year had the theme of the 140th School Birthday. A free place at one of the RSM's Medical Careers Day conferences (usually £15): Providing practical advice on the university application process, interview scenarios and an insight into life as a medical student and practitioner.

The Medic Portal resource: As an official partner of The Medic Portal online resource, students can access mock preparation questions for UKCAT and BMAT exams, medical school selection advice and help with writing personal statements for medicine.

Online videos, ejournals and e-books: An extensive range of online educational material including free access to watch RSM lectures online, 5,000+ ejournals and 7,500+ ebooks

The RSM's world class medical library: One of the largest medical libraries in Europe open 24/7. Plenty of room for study (private study rooms available free of charge) with access to PCs and free Wi-Fi plus free printing and photocopying.
