LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers, Students and Staff

We have come to the end of the term and the end of 2018. As always the last few days of term have been filled with activities to mark the season, including a Christmas Fair and the Carol Service yesterday. On Monday we had a super evening with our Year 13 students from last year who came back to receive their A Level certificates and awards. This event is always such a pleasant one, as we meet with our students, who are now a few months on from leaving school and beginning the next stage of their journey through life. As always I invite a former student to present the certificates to the students and this year our speaker was **Jane Cox**, who left Kendrick 19 years ago. In what has become the tradition of speakers, she gave the students some advice that she said she would have given her 18 year old self:

- 1. **Be brave and don't be afraid to try things:** don't be afraid if things don't work out, keep trying.
- 2. **The more you put in, the more you get out:** whatever you do in life, usually the effort you put in determines what you get out of it.
- 3. **Focus on the positives in life:** be grateful for them and share the positive thoughts you have with people around you.

I focused on Jane's advice in assembly today but also asked the students to think of other themes we have considered this year, most particularly the theme of **peace**. We spoke a lot about peace in the commemorations of the end of the First World War and once again I asked the students to consider how peace can come into their lives. Sometimes students can fall out with one another and in these circumstances some harsh words and hurtful comments can be said. I hope that as everyone leaves for the holiday they can find peace in their hearts and positive and supportive things to say to each other so that they can enjoy a restful and peaceful holiday.

My thanks to everyone for all the hard work, effort and determination that you have shown to the school this year. I am so pleased and proud of our successes this year which are the result of the dedication and commitment that everyone shows to our school. Thank you to our staff, students, parents, governors and friends of Kendrick; everyone's support and encouragement helps us in what we do.
