### WEEKLY LETTER FROM MR SIMMONDS, ACTING HEADTEACHER

This is the time of year when we turn our thoughts to Sixth Form admissions for the following year. In school this week Year 11 had a post 16 conference on Tuesday during which they explored all the options they have for studying and working after GCSEs; they looked at what they want from a Sixth Form, they learnt more about Sixth Form study at Kendrick and they were given the latest information on apprenticeships. This week we are launching our virtual Sixth Form information videos and materials for all prospective sixth formers; in a normal year we would be having a live Sixth Form Open Evening but of course that is not possible this year.

Today there was an own clothes day to raise money for the Kendrick Parents Society and thanks goes to everyone for supporting this and to KPS for their on-going support of the school. We are all looking forward to their fabulous and innovative Cultural Evening on **Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2020.** I am delighted by the number of new parents who are joining KPS and paying the very modest subscription; thank you all for doing this.

We had a very special Remembrance Day registration time on Wednesday in which all forms listened to and reflected on words of remembrance written by Ms Kattirtzi and read by form tutors before listening to Iris in Year 13 playing a fabulous rendition of the Last Post and observing a minute's silence.

Last week I had a chance encounter outside the school with a representative of the education team at Reading International Solidarity Centre, RISC, who offer training and support for making the most of local historical links and we discussed the historical figures who built and subsequent lived in Sidmouth House, one of our older buildings. They had a camera man with them and I believe that a short piece was run on local news. It seems that Sidmouth House was built by the Hon. John Broderick who received £2000 in slave compensation money in 1835, the same year that he began building Sidmouth House. The History department has already started to plan how to bring this connection into teaching around slavery in Year 8. We already know that Henry Addington, 1<sup>st</sup> Viscount Sidmouth, Prime Minister 1801 to 1804 and Home Secretary 1812 to 1822, is linked to the building as well as donating to the town of Reading four acres of land on which the Royal Berkshire Hospital now stands. For all of you who are more affected by lockdown I hope that these weeks will pass well for you and maybe this is an important step in the country's management of the virus. ### AUTUMN PROFILING DAY – WEDNESDAY 18<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2020

As part of our programme of assessment and reporting the students receive an interim profiling interview with their Form Tutor or Teaching and Learning Coordinator, which is then followed up by an interim report to parents. This year's session of profiling will take place on **Wednesday 18th November.** 

On this day:

- Year 7 students should come into school for the full day as usual. They will spend half of the day in a Study Skills Workshop. The other half of the day will be spent on a project and during this time they will have their profiling interview and complete their report statement.
- Year 8 students will be at home all day and will have their interview remotely and spend the rest of the day on an activity set by the Teaching and Learning Coordinator.
- Year 9 students will come in for school for half a day for a careers activity and profiling interview. The rest of the time at school and home will be spent on an activity set by their Teaching and Learning Coordinator. The first half of the register will come in between 8.25am to 11.30am and the second half of the register will come in between 12.10pm and 3.15pm. Confirmed timings and further details of their session will be given by their tutor.

- Year 10 students will stay at home and will have their interview remotely and spend the rest of the day on an activity set by their Teaching and Learning Coordinator.
- Year 11 students will stay at home and will have their interview remotely and spend the rest of the day completing an activity around 6th form options/future choices set by their Teaching and Learning Coordinator.
- Year 12 students will come into school for a session and profiling interview and spend the rest of the day on an activity set by their Teaching and Learning Coordinator. Students will be advised of session timings by their tutor.
- Year 13 students will stay at home and will have their interview remotely and spend the rest of the day on an activity set by their Teaching and Learning Coordinator.

Further details of the activities set and profiling interview times will be given to the students.

The canteen will be open for hot and cold meals between 11.30am -12.10pm. Students who are in school can stay or come early for a meal if they wish. Students eligible for free school meals who are in school are welcome to come into school to have a meal and should speak to their tutor regarding arrangements for this.

Students who are due to be at home and would find a remote profiling interview difficult should speak to their form tutor to discuss arrangements.

### SATURDAY STEM SPECTACULAR

The event is being organised by the ASE working in collaboration with the University of Wolverhampton. It is an online STEM engagement event for people of all ages. The event is on **November 21st 2020 from 10-2pm**. There will be live and online presentations, will a range of activities aimed at primary children in the morning followed by an amazing lab tour. There will be a visit by presenters from Wales and NI around midday. The afternoon session will include presentations 5 or 6 aimed at older students and this will be followed by a provocative panel discussion to finish the day.
