FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION (FGM)

At the age of six, she was the victim of FGM, an event she has described as "being engulfed in pain from head to toe".

PRIVATE FOSTERING

Private fostering is an arrangement whereby a child under the age of 16 (or 18 if the child has a disability) (S.66 Children Act 1989) is placed for 28 days or more in the care of someone who is not the child's parent(s) or a 'connected person'.

A connected person is defined as a 'relative, friend or other person connected with a child'. The latter is likely to include person(s) who have a pre-existing relationship with the child, for example, a teacher who knows the child in a professional capacity.

Private foster carers can be from the extended family, e.g. a cousin or a great aunt, **but cannot be a relative** as defined under the **Children Act 1989, section 105**:

'A relative under the Children Act 1989 is defined as a 'grandparent, brother, sister, uncle or aunt (whether full blood or half blood or by marriage or civil partnership) or step-parent'.

If you meet the definition of a 'connected person', please see our page on Family and Friends Care.

It is imperative that Kendrick School and the Local Authority are notified if a child is living with someone who is not their parent or a 'connected person' for longer than 28 days. The local authority need to be satisfied that the placement is suitable and the child is safe. To be defined as 'private fostering', the child must be living with that person for longer than 28 days and this should be continuous but can include occasional short breaks.

WOMEN'S AID RAIL TO REFUGE SCHEME

Accessing money can be difficult for women experiencing domestic abuse, particularly if they are experiencing

financial abuse. This can stop women from travelling to safety and may be a huge barrier to support.

Launched in the March 2020 by railway station manager, Darren O'Brien, the Women's Aid Rail to Refuge scheme means that survivors with a confirmed refuge space can travel for free across England, Scotland and Wales. The cost of tickets is covered by the Rail Delivery Group and has been extended until the end of March 2021.

Once the person has contacted a women's aid service and a refuge vacancy has been confirmed a ticket can be allocated.
