LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers, Students and Staff

Although we still have a few days before the end of term, one of the greatest highlights of this time of the year is the **Christmas Concert**. Last night's concert was fantastic and was packed with beautiful pieces from a number of ensembles and groups. As always, the stars of the concert were Year 7 who finished the event with two lovely Christmas songs. Thank you to the wonderfully talented students we have and of course to the dedicated staff who support, most particularly, Mrs Cooper, who planned, organised and delivered such a superb concert. It was made even better by the fact that it finished at 8.30pm allowing everyone to get home at a reasonable time.

Charity events always feature at this time of the year. **School Council** has run an initiative asking every form in the school to assemble a Christmas Gift Box. The younger years have put together toy boxes and the older years have collected Body Boxes containing sanitary products for young girls. Over 50 boxes are ready to be collected and distributed by the Churches of Reading Charity. At the same time we have had a Food Drive which has been organised by our **Amnesty** group and over 500 items of food has been collected and will be distributed by the Food Bank organisation in Reading. There is also a sock collection taking place and today everyone is wearing a Christmas jumper to raise money for Save the Children Fund. A short building update from the works that started in the summer. The Conservatory (extension to the Library), primarily intended as an overspill area for the canteen, is completely finished and functioning well, not only as a dining space, but also as a work area for students, given its close proximity to the Library. The external works to Sidmouth House have taken much longer than planned and it is likely that the scaffolding will be with us for a little longer next year to complete these works. Internal decoration of the building is coming along very quickly and we hope these works will be finished by the time we return in January. We will then have a few months of quiet, I hope, before the major new building will begin in the summer of 2019, in preparation for the new intake in September 2020.

Last week I mentioned the Mental Health workshops that are taking place at Kendrick and Reading Girls' School. The workshop on **Anxiety** took place at Kendrick on Wednesday evening and was well attended by parents. A recognition of these issues is important for all of us so that we can support our students in their mental wellbeing. Teachers have been asked not to set homework for Years 7-10 in the holidays and I also hope that Years 11 and 13, despite Mock examinations in January, will take a break from their studies and have a well-earned rest and enjoy the time away from school. Sextortion Emails

The BBC recently ran a story about sextortion emails. These emails were particularly disturbing as the subject line included the recipient's password, which give the bogus email credibility to the sender's pretence that they had infected the computer. The BBC's report refers to a website called 'Have I been pwned?' (Pronounced like 'powned') where you can enter your email address and find out if your email and password have ever been stolen in a data breach.

When changes are proposed to admission arrangements, all admission authorities must consult on their admission arrangements (including any supplementary information form) that will apply for admission applications the following school year.

The key changes to Kendrick School admission policies are as follows:

Year 7

- Introduction of Priority Area 1 designated area
- Introduction of a lower qualifying score for Categories 1 and 2 in the oversubscription criteria

Year 12

• Introduction of Priority Area 1 designated area

Non Routine

Introduction of Priority Area 1 designated area

A map of Priority Area 1 will be available in due course.
