Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Today is a no less busy, with Year 10 GCSE Drama students performing pantos to primary school children from Katesgrove and Geoffrey Field School, two local primaries. All students have such fun on these occasions, with Kendrick students encouraging the wonderful audience participation from the primary children. Another performance occasion this week has been the Evening of Dance which featured group performances from across the school with all four Year 7 Tutor groups performing their group dance. Some beautiful individual performances from GSCE and A Level PE students made the evening a special event. Thank you to all our students who have been involved in these events this week, both on and off stage. Next week is the Christmas Concert, on Thursday 18th December, please come to support us on this final event of the term. Year 7 will be performing again!

Today many students and staff are wearing Christmas jumpers as part of the <u>Save the Children</u> initiative to raise funds for the charity's Christmas Appeal. We are asking parents for a donation of £2 and this can be paid directly to Save the Children by using the QR code further down in this update. Also, KPS has been delighted with the response from parents on the Wishlist contributions which have reached the target of £5k. This means that all the items on the Wishlist will be bought for departments. KPS has agreed that any extra money raised will go towards replacing an Inter Active Whiteboard in one of the classrooms. It was International Human Rights Day on Wednesday, and a group of sixth formers led the school in a letter writing campaign called Write for Rights, an initiative run by the charity Amnesty International. Over 100 letters have been written to the governments of South Africa, Cambodia and Ecuador expressing our concern at the injustices that exist against specific groups of young people in these countries. An article is being prepared for the website for next week. This activity aligns so well with the part of our pledge that says we promise to stand against injustice. Thank you to everyone involved. To end with a few more meaningful words, as expressed in our poem for Advent today, below is a poem which as Mr Dilley tells us 'is a sonnet which captures what appears to be a very simple but beautiful moment - a snowflake landing on two young skaters just as they are about to kiss (the final rhyming couplet perhaps mirroring their kiss). The poem explores the apparently random and unplanned events that led up to this moment - the formation of the snowflake from vapour rising to the sky, and its journey over "countless miles" to reach its destination: it could so easily not have happened, and yet it does. The snowflake is compared to love, "sensing, seeking out, its destiny", and there is something very touching about the way that the male skater also "blocks the wind raging from the south". Baer seems to be highlighting the innocence and fragility of both the snowflake and of young love, and yet both survive to coincide perfectly at this moment.'
