Weekly Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Term 2 has started very well particularly for many of our older students who last night attended our hugely successful **Design Your Future** Careers event. Targeted at Years 9-13 this event enables students and parents to speak to employers from a wide range of employment to explore what career opportunities are available and what qualifications and routes to employment there are. Working with the organisation **Learning to Work**, our Work Related Learning Coordinator, **Mrs Rock** organised a brilliant event for our school and our thanks go to her. There will be a report and photos on the website in due course.

At the start of the week four students, Ms Fallows and I attended a **Climate Conference** organised by the Brighter Futures for Children, Reading. The Lead Councillor for Education, Ashley Pearce, announced that Reading Borough Council has set itself a target of zero emissions by 2030. The conference for Headteachers and students was the launch of their campaign for education to encourage schools and students to work on this initiative and target. At Kendrick, our **Eco Group** has done much work to raise awareness of climate change issues as well as changing attitudes and practice on recycling. At the conference a group of our students gave a presentation which you can look at here. The students were highly praised for their presentation.

An update on how our former student Mary Lobo and her College, Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford, got on in the TV quiz University Challenge; I am delighted to say that Mary and her team, which included Ms Le Croissette's son, Matthew Le Croissette, won their round and have now got through to the next stage in the competition. We wish them well for their next challenge.

Our building works have started and the back of the school has restricted parking and pedestrian access. Students have been reminded of the need for safety and care as they walk around the school. The Head Girl Team will be taking photos from their vantage point at the top of the Sixth Form Block on a daily basis to chart the progress of the build.

Many of you may know from coverage in the media that tomorrow, 9th November is the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall, the physical barrier that divided the West and Eastern Countries in Europe. In excellent assemblies to all of the school, Mr Curran and Miss Heath reiterated to the students the historical background and reasons why there was a wall in Berlin in East Germany and why it came down. Frau Alderson shared her memories of her life growing up in a divided Germany and Frau Mueller spoke about what it means for her to be East German today. The History and the German Departments would like to invite you to share your own memories and thoughts on the fall of the Berlin Wall with your children. I think it is important for our students and our school community to be reminded about such hugely important historical events which have shaped our history and which still have an impact on us and our politics today. Please encourage your children to take an interest and research and read about the collapse of the Berlin Wall which may lead them to even more reading about events in the post-World War

Two era, including the Cold War and East West Relations. There will be displays around the school on the historical context of the Berlin Wall and recommended History books, fiction and non-fiction, for students to read. Parent and Carer Online Toolkit (Childnet)

Childnet have updated their parent and carer toolkit that will help parents have conversations about online safety. Their booklet 'Let's talk about life online' includes ten key messages that should be shared with children:

- 1. "You can always come to me if you need help."
- 2. "What would you do if this happened...?"
- 3. "Remember that not everyone is who they say they are online."
- 4. "Keep your personal information safe, and other people's too."
- 5. "Be respectful to others online."
- 6. "Think before you post."
- 7. "Remember to ask if it's okay."
- 8. "Remember not everything is true online."
- 9. "The things other people post online might not always show what their life is really like."
- 10. "Recognise how going online makes you feel and take a break when you need to."

The KPS Disco is on 6th December for Years 7-9, please book online for tickets. We need volunteers for this event too, please reach out if you have some time to help!



Kendrick Parents' Society are organising an Own Clothes Day on Monday 11th November. Please bring a donation of £2 – all proceeds go to the school. Please be aware of the Dress Code which you can find on your form information booklets.

Non Uniform Events Policy

If students are not expected to wear uniform because of a charity event or because they are on a trip their clothing should be appropriate for the working environment/activities that they are taking part in.



In line with the dress code in the sixth form the following points should be noted:

Examples of unacceptable clothing items are: - cropped tops, low cut vest tops, strapless tops, very short skirts or shorts and ripped jeans.

- There should not be flesh on show between the top itself and the top of the skirt or trouser.
- Hats are not to be worn in school. The wearing of a head scarf or hijab is permitted, for religious reasons, but the wearing of the niqab is not permitted.
- Extremes of make up or hair colour are unacceptable.
- No flip flop shoes.
- Tee shirts should not display extreme / offensive views or comments.

The election period will commence at midday on **Wednesday 20th November** and will close at midday on **Wednesday 27th November.** The vote will be counted at 12.15pm on that day and the results will be published as soon as possible thereafter.
