MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING POLICY

At Kendrick School we do so many excellent things in school to support and build good mental health and wellbeing in our students. We have coordinated all what we do into a Mental Health and Wellbeing Policy which you can access <u>here</u>.

The policy aims to:

- Promote positive mental health and emotional wellbeing to our school community.
- Increase understanding and awareness of common mental health issues.
- Enable staff to identify and respond to early warning signs of mental ill health in students.
- Enable staff to understand how and when to access support when working with young people with mental health issues.
- Provide the right support to students with mental health issues and know where to signpost them and their parents/carers for specific support
- Develop resilience amongst students and raise awareness of resilience-building techniques.
- Raise awareness amongst staff and gain recognition from the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) that staff may
 have mental health issues, and that they are supported in relation to looking after their wellbeing; instilling a
 culture of staff and student welfare where everyone is aware of signs and symptoms with effective
 signposting, underpinned by behaviour and welfare around school.

The policy is in consultation stage until **Friday 13th January 2023**, and we welcome your comments on the policy during this period.
