Weekly Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

As the term progresses, we are able to report some news of activities students have been involved in so far in 2020. The **Ski Trip** led by Mr Stride returned just after New Year and yesterday I spoke to a few Sixth form students who told me how much they enjoyed their trip in the Italian mountains. Many of them snowboarded for the first time, which was not without some minor injuries, but they told me that despite having very sore wrists they would be happy to go again anytime! The **Robot Club**, a strong favourite of Year 8 -10 students, went on its first competition of the year this week. Coordinated by Mr Hayes, a group of 16 students went Harwell RAL campus, in Oxford for the Lego League Regional Final. After hours of designing and practising with their robot model, and competing against 20 schools, they proudly won the trophy for the best designed robot. There are some photos and a report here.

Members of the **Head Girl Team and Eco Group** saw me last week to propose an **Own Clothes Day** next **Friday 24**th **January** to raise money for World Wildlife Fund (WWF) to support the Bush Fire disaster in southern Australia (the students will be asked to wear green or blue for a donation of £2). I don't think anyone can fail to have noticed or seen the scenes of the terrible devastation caused by the fires across parts of Australia; devastation to homes, human life and the unique animal population of Australia. As well as an own clothes day, the Eco Group will run an interactive session in the Hall at second break next Friday, demonstrating to students the scale of the tragedy and devastation and consider again the consequences of climate change on the planet. I expect there will be a huge response to their presentation.

KPS had their first meeting of the year and it was with great excitement that the spring raffle plans were explained to us by parents and committee members, Mrs Morgan and Mrs Skipsey. Kendrick Spring raffle will be electronic this year! After very careful consideration by the KPS committee and staff and after a small trail run, we have decided that Kendrick parents and our community, being so electronically able, will be able embrace such a move. We understand that very few schools have tried this approach so we haven't been able to talk to any parent groups about their experiences, so we are taking a leap in the dark as true 'pioneers' in this area. I really do hope parents and friends will take to this new approach to fund raising and we will be able to raise at least as much money as we did last year from paper sales of tickets. The raffle will be launched on Monday 2nd March and will be 'drawn' or revealed on a screen at the spring concert on Tuesday 31st March. You will hear much more about it in the next few weeks from me and through the KPS newsletter which this year will come to you once a fortnight and not once a week.

Finally I would like to thank and congratulate our Year 11 students for conducting themselves so well through the intense period of their Mock Examinations. They are now back in lessons and waiting for their results and review of their scripts, the latter being the most important part of the whole exercise. I hope they will continue to appreciate that these exams were aimed to help them focus and plan what they need to do in the next few months in terms of work and revision. For the teachers there is a considerable amount of marking that needs to be done and I hope

students are patient as the process of marking takes place. Thank you to all staff involved in the smooth and efficient running the mocks examination period.

If the election is contested, a poll by secret ballot will be held. The election will be conducted electronically and been designed to ensure that the election is secret and anonymous, is limited to one vote per person and ensures that only those entitled to vote can take part in the election.

If you do not wish to participate in the election via this method, please contact the Clerk to the Governing Body to make arrangements for a ballot paper to be posted to you and to ensure you are excluded from the online voting system.

The election period will commence at midday on **Thursday 30**th **January** and will close at midday on **Thursday 6**th **February 2020.** The vote will be counted at 12.15pm on that day and the results will be published as soon as possible thereafter.

Performer Series 3 - Piano Masterclass with Dr Nigel Wilkinson – Wednesday 12th February, Masterclass at 4pm, Concert at 6.30pm

Students are invited to attend a Piano Masterclass with Dr Nigel Wilkinson. He has worked as a senior producer for BBC Radio 3 for many years and now works mainly as a pianist, teacher, ABRSM examiner and adjudicator for events such as BBC Young Musician of the Year and Music for Youth. During this event, selected students will be able to work with Dr Wilkinson to develop their pieces in a masterclass fashion in which they receive feedback and expert tips on how to improve their technique. There will also be a brief discussion about how to prepare for practical examinations and an informal Q+A session in which anyone can ask questions. This will culminate in a discussion and performance from Dr Wilkinson and the masterclass students.

All students learning the piano, regardless of ability, are invited to sign up for this event. This is free for Kendrick students but those attending from other schools will be charged a small fee of £5 to help cover costs. The concert itself will also cost £5 per adult and children may enter for free.

2020 Walter Hussey Composition Competition

We have been sent the information below from Reading Phoenix Choir

The 2020 competition follows Reading Phoenix Choir's aim of working with young people and is for composers aged between 16 and 24. With a 1st prize of £500 and a 2nd prize of £200, a line-up of top judges from the choral and composition world and no entry fee, the Walter Hussey Composition Competition continues to be one of the leading choral composition competitions of our time. The competition is named in honour of Walter Hussey, Dean of Chichester Cathedral from 1955 to 1977, who commissioned many choral works throughout his lifetime. Entry for the 2020 competition will start in January 2020, with a deadline for entries of 30th June 2020. The winner is expected to be chosen by December 2020 and the winning piece will receive its world premiere in March 2021.

The 2020 Walter Hussey Composition Competition is being promoted by Reading Phoenix Choir and having celebrated its 50th anniversary season in 2019, the theme for the competition is both encouraging the musicians of the future and looking forwards, and is therefore 'New Horizons'.
