WEEKLY LETTER FROM MR SIMMONDS, ACTING HEADTEACHER

We had snow on the ground on Monday and very few here to enjoy it. I hope that last weekend you managed to get out and enjoy those massive snowflakes and the snow that had the very best consistency for making snowmen and snowballs.

On Wednesday it was <u>Holocaust Memorial Day</u> and Ms Kattirtzi recorded an assembly for the school's community to help them pause and reflect. This year theme for Holocaust Memorial Day is 'Be the light in the darkness'. We are all encouraged to reflect on the depths that humanity can sink to, but also the ways individuals and communities resisted that darkness to 'be the light' before, during and after the genocide. This year, as always, students from Kendrick will participate in the Lessons From Auschwitz Programme. This year, sadly, they have had to adapt the programme, removing the visit to Auschwitz but maintaining a three-part structure of remote meetings.

Last night we had the parent and teacher consultation afternoon for Year 12 and it is amazing how conducting these meetings remotely has already become quite natural. There are some advantages as well as parents are not having to travel and park and the software keeps everyone strictly to time. I thoroughly enjoyed chatting to the students and their parents in my class.

In the news this week we learnt that the school will not be opening to students again until at least 8th March 2021 and that there would be two weeks' notice given in advance of any return to school. The delivery of remote learning continues to dominate many of the agendas in school and the feedback that students and parents have given to the school always feed into these discussions. In our survey of all students conducted through the online register last week we found that on average across the school students are receiving half their lessons in a live format and the other half have a mixture of activities including set work, challenges, projects and pre-recorded content. This balance

feels about right and we remain mindful that there is a wide variation in everyone's ready access to live lessons and that time away from computer screens is terribly important. We are also conscious of the work load for staff and students and you should find that all work set to students is carefully time bonded so that students know how long they should work on each task and that they should stop when the time is up.

Since last week the swimming pool is now empty of water and ready to be renovated and I will keep you updated with this project.

Ofqual's consultation on the mechanism to award A level and GCSE grades closes tonight. We have debated the strengths and weaknesses of the proposals and many staff have given a response to Ofqual and I encourage you all to do so as well if you have time tonight before the window closes.

As always I wish everyone a safe and fun weekend and we will all be refreshed and ready for the week ahead.

This year we cannot send out paper version of the data sheets so it is very important that you sign up for School Gateway so you can check the details we have on record for you. It will also mean that you are receiving all the information from us that you need.
- View your child's medical details and can inform us of any changes
- View your child's timetable
- View your child's report (when it is available)
- Report your child's absence and see their attendance stats
