Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

I would like to begin with highlighting the webinar that was sent to you last week, made by Ms Hyde. This is the second in the series of webinars that Ms Hyde has produced for students across the school. Based on feedback we have received from students in focus groups and surveys, Ms Hyde has skilfully researched and presented appropriate content to assist parents and students manage some of the issues that present themselves to them as they develop and mature in school. We had another pleasant hour with Year 8/9 parents last night at the second Drop-in session this year. Once again hosted by KPS over 50 parents joined the call and asked very sensible and pertinent questions about school life. Obvious interest at this moment is around option choices for Year 9 going into Year 10 which is coming up after half term and parents will be invited to an Information Evening on Wednesday 4th March to hear the presentation of the process we go through at Kendrick on the Options process. I did reiterate again to parents the message that students do enough academic work in school and do not need additional tuition. We are hearing that some students across the school are receiving additional tutoring in some subjects just to be ahead of the teaching of topics in schools. We do not advise this, and students need to be led by one teacher and that is their teacher in school who knows the curriculum and specification that needs to be covered and is practised in doing this. However, I am pleased and grateful to the support parents want to give their children's learning and that is vital in the overall success of any child during their schooling.

We have delivered some excellent assemblies to student on safeguarding themes most recently on misogyny and the importance of one's digital footprint. There has also been form led assemblies and this week 8TCA presented a super assembly on the importance of Relationships and how to nurture and have good and respectful relationships. I was pleased to hear them use the terminology that we use in school about speaking to a trusted adult should they find themselves in a situation where the relationship/friendship they are having with anyone is beginning to be uncomfortable. Well done 8TCA and Ms Campbell their tutor.

A question that came up at last night's parental drop-in was about work experience across the school. This is part of the bigger area of education that all schools are obliged to deliver which is Careers Education. Like all schools we need to provide careers education that is outlined in a guidance document known as the [Gatsby Benchmarks](#). There are 8 benchmarks schools need to cover with their students:

1. A stable careers programme
2. Learning from career and labour market information
3. Addressing the needs of each young person
4. Linking curriculum learning to careers
5. Encounters with employers and employees
6. Experiences in the workplace
7. Encounters with Further and Higher Education
8. Personal guidance
