LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

This week is **Children's Mental Health Week**, the theme this year is **Growing Together**. Every day this week students and staff have been sent information on mental health and wellbeing from <u>Mind</u> and other support groups aimed at young people aged 11-18. The theme Growing Together is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. Challenges and setbacks can help us to grow and adapt and trying new things can help us to move beyond our comfort zone into a new realm of possibility and potential. It was also **Safer Internet Day** on Tuesday 8th February and again information was sent to students and parents, see link HERE.

These initiatives, once again, recognise the difficulties that young people face, made more challenging by the pandemic, which affected their life and education. It very much confirms all that we do in school to support our students. Sometimes students may feel unable to access the help there is available to them or communicate what they want to us, and sometimes, as a school it is difficult for us to access the more specialist services that some students need. However, I hope everyone at Kendrick appreciates the very high priority we give to trying to support our students' positive mental health and wellbeing. Our **Student Welfare Team**, working alongside our team of No 5 Counsellors, is growing and developing in its strength and expertise, and the facilities that we have created in the school for students, demonstrate the priority this has at Kendrick. The Department of Education, published a report this week as part of **Children's Mental Health Week**, called <u>State of the Nation report</u>, the third report that has been produced on this subject. The report is very well worth reading and outlines, with statistical analysis and research, that young people's mental health has been affected by the pandemic. It concludes: 'With ongoing pandemic uncertainties, it remains as important as ever to continue to monitor children and young people's mental health and wellbeing, both to build our understanding of pandemic recovery, and to understand whether there are certain groups at risk of ongoing poorer mental health and/or wellbeing.'

At the end of Term 2, in December 2021 we sent everyone, students, staff, parents and governors, a survey about sexual abuse in school, following the Ofsted report on this topic in June 2021 Led and organised by Mrs Lace and Mr Duncan, our PHSCE Leads across the school, our survey sought to do our own anonymised review into sexual abuse in our setting. In summary, the review found that students feel, in an overwhelming majority, that they are safe from sexual abuse whilst they are in school. There were some areas where we need to follow up with regard to knowledge, education and practice, and to that end, we have identified 11 action points which we will be following up. We shared the report and findings with our governors last night at the **Performance and Review Committee** meeting and will report back to them later in the year on the progress of the action points.

We believe that surveying students on issues that affect their life enables us to better understand the circumstances they find themselves in, as well as enable us to refresh our knowledge and practice and the information and guidance we give them. Another survey conducted recently, has been to consider the impact of **social media on young people's lives**, which was carried out by Miss Hyde. It revealed some useful information for us to work on with our students on this theme. Our annual **Transition survey with Year 7** parents has also been very useful and provided information to us about how well the transition to secondary school and Kendrick was last year. Overwhelmingly, the one-week Summer School we offered students last July, was very much appreciated and said to have considerably eased the transition to Kendrick for our Year 7 students.

This is the time of the year that I highlight to students the **Bursaries and Awards** available to them. Through the generous and kind donations of people associated with the school, there are four major awards available to them. Two of the awards are for students in Year 11 and 13 only and the Trust Awards are also available to students who left the school within the last five years. Please see the link here.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone of the KPS Bingo and Quiz Night that is taking place tomorrow 12th February between 6.00-7.30pm, as a remote event. - 1. Have something to look forward to make a plan with your children for the weekend.
- 2. Stay connected your children may need help to keep in touch with their friends and extended family.
- 3. **Filter your information intake** remember that young people with phones/ tablets may also feel bombarded by news and need help with this.



- 4. **Have a check-in regularly with how everyone in the family is feeling.** It's a great habit to develop and can help give your children the vocabulary they need to discuss how they feel.
- 5. Think of something you are grateful for each day make it a habit at dinner or bedtime.
- 6. **Try something new/creative.** If you fancy something musical there is something online for all ages and you don't need lots of instruments! Look at <u>Jessie's Fund</u>, <u>Mini Chilterns</u>, 'Beat goes on' body percussion, <u>Chrome Music Lab</u>, <u>Beatboxing tutorials</u> and/or <u>Singing Hands/Out of the Ark Music</u> for songs with Makaton signing.
