This week has all been about the experiences of remote learning and teaching and, for the Year 11 students, the remote mock examinations. I understand how much harder it is to study remotely and the wellbeing of all students and staff is the highest priority on the school's agenda at this time. With this in mind the remote learning plan, which you can find on the website, is being reviewed and an updated version will be posted next week.

Once Ofqual has just launched its consultation on replacing summer examinations we will be working through the proposals in order to feed into the consultation process. I will keep all parents and students who are due to take public examinations this year updated throughout the consultation and afterwards once the final procedures are known. At this time the best we can do is carry on working on our planned curriculum in order to be as well prepared as possible for whatever is required.

May I point your attention to the online links that KPS have set up for us that are an easy way to shop and raise funds for the school at the same time.

At this week's KPS meeting an exciting set of new ideas to connect our community together and to raise further funds were discussed. Finances were high on the agenda and I am delighted with the great range of projects that KPS fundraising is supporting the school with, including more outdoor benches and play equipment, curtains and lights in the Drama Studio, enhancements for the Horizons building, furniture for our new student welfare safe space and redecoration of toilets across the school. In addition to this there is some money given in a legacy to KPS that we are starting to spend bigger projects with news of these to follow.

Since last week we have decided to give the name of 'Anna's Café' to the corner of the canteen where the breakfast service operates and drinks and snacks are sold. This is in memory of Anna Franco who started working at the school in 2011 and a plaque is being commissioned accordingly. I know that some students are collating their memories of Anna to send to her family.

I am delighted that next week, with the help of our student volunteers, we will be starting up again the Widening Horizons homework club remotely for Year 5 students.

This week I attended an online drawing lesson and had immense fun being on the receiving end of a live lesson complete with shared screens, mute/unmute, 'putting it in the chat' and ultimately a wonderful shared experience. I trust that everyone in our school community can still find things that they love to do and fills them with hope and good spirit.

OMEGLE

Omegle is a website that pairs random strangers for live text or video chats. It was first launched in 2009 and its slogan is "Talk to strangers!" There is an option for adult (18+) content and a section for people aged 13+ with parental permission. Anyone can use the site. Users simply go to Omegle.com and then choose 'Text' or 'Video' chat and the page states how many users are currently online. Depending on the time of day this can be hundreds of thousands. Omegle markets itself as a great way to meet new friends however has been known to feature pornography and inappropriate content within chats, so it is important parents are aware of the risks associated with the site.
