WEEKLY LETTER FROM MR SIMMONDS, ACTING HEADTEACHER

While we continue to wait for news on how examination grades will be awarded this summer and on when school may begin to reopen, the main topic of discussion in school this week has remained remote learning. We regularly receive feedback through tutors and TLCs from different year groups and from teachers through our various meetings. We are trying hard to give a variety of learning activities that do not over or under use live teaching and screen time. Lessons with an element of both live content and set tasks are being used to good effect to help achieve this balance. Teachers often ask students to put on their cameras more readily and I echo this request as teaching to a wall of inanimate icons rather than responsive faces is very hard work. The ongoing feedback of nods, smiles, frowns, heads down working or heads up looking around makes the teaching process much easier and more rewarding.

Our Librarians Mrs Cavaciuti and Mrs Williamson have created another wonderful display 'Meet the Latest Female Noble Prize Winners', in the vestibule ready for the students' return to school. You can view this display on our website via this link.

I am told that many parents still need to connect to School Gateway and I encourage all parents to do this especially as we are aiming to issue the next sets of school reports through the Gateway. This week we received over £20,000 from the Kendrick Parents Society, an amount that represents money raised by KPS and some money left to the society in a legacy to be spent on music and the arts. We have budgeted for this money to be spent on a variety of projects including the Horizons building, benches, play equipment, a new student welfare office and adjoining safe space, musical instruments including an orchestral harp and LED stage lighting in the Drama Studio. You will hear more about these projects in due course; in the meantime many, many thanks again to KPS and everyone who supports their activities.

In regards to our LFD rapid testing centre, I see that there are still over 200 consent forms to come in and we would like these as soon as possible to enable the time consuming registration process to continue and for us to be ready for mass testing when school opens.
