# Kendrick School - Weekly Update Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2023

### LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Today, 27<sup>th</sup> January, is **Holocaust Memorial Day.** This date in January marks the time when in 1945, 78 years ago, the Nazi concentration camp in Auschwitz in Poland was liberated by the allies. Since 2001, this date has become the day when we remember the millions of Jews who died in those camps, as well as those who have died in the other genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur. At Kendrick on this day every year we have a whole school assembly to inform our community about such events and remember the people involved. We also highlight the work of the <u>Holocaust Memorial Trust</u> and consider the theme that the trust suggests each year for us to consider. This year the theme is *Ordinary People* and a few of our A Level History students prepared a presentation on this theme for the assembly. In addition, a <u>new display has been put up in the library</u> and vestibule and our annual <u>Holocaust Poetry Competition</u> has been launched. Also, two of the history students will be embarking on a visit to Auschwitz on the *Lessons from Auschwitz* programme sponsored by the Trust next month.

On Wednesday evening, the PE Department presented to parents an **Evening of Dance** following the Dance Enterprise Day last week. As always, the event was a super spectacle of talent and creativity showcasing dance routines on a given theme from students in Years 7-10. Thank you to Mrs Watkins and the PE Department for organising this great highlight of our school calendar and providing the students which such a great opportunity to express themselves through dance and music.

This week 6<sup>th</sup> Form students were introduced to this year's round of **Bursaries and Grants** which are available to students across the school. Some of these grants apply to students across the whole school and some to students in specific year groups. The link to the information is <u>here</u>. I urge students and parents to look at the various awards available and the opportunities that are being provided to our students to apply for some money to explore an interest they may have.

I have communicated information to all parents about the strike action in schools next Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February. All students in Years 10-13 will be in school. Students in Years 7-9 are asked to be at home for the day. Further details can be found below in the Weekly Update.

I will finish this week's update as I finished the assembly this morning by sharing with you again our Kendrick Pledge. The pledge came about from a visit I made to Auschwitz over 10 years ago with two History students on the *Lessons from Auschwitz* programme. The lesson we brought back from the trip was a determination inform our community of the worst of human behaviour and try to teach our community how they can be the best versions of themselves. Our pledge is an aspiration that is intended for all of us to endeavour to be a decent and caring individual, kind and respectful to others. I know that at times not everyone's behaviour is in line with the pledge, however this statement of our values is intended to give us a constant reminder of how we ought to behave and be with each other. Perhaps this weekend parents and students may like to consider the words and intent of the pledge particularly in the context of marking Holocaust Memorial Day.

### **SAFEGUARDING – BLUE WHALE CHALLENGE**

Please read the information via this <u>link</u> and below produced by the **UK Safer Internet Centre** on the Blue Whale Challenge which has recently been in the news:

"<u>Our Professionals Online Safety Helpline</u> has recently <u>seen an increase in the number of calls that they have</u> received about the 'Blue Whale story'. We have written this advice for those who are concerned about this story, as well as expert opinions and other news stories to help support professionals and parents who might be concerned about young people online.

#### What is the 'Blue Whale story'?

In the last month many media outlets have reported on the so called 'Blue Whale' phenomenon which has been claimed to be responsible for a number of teenager's deaths in Russia.

It is through research and consultation with other colleagues at the time of this blog it has come to our attention that the 'Blue Whale' is an example of a sensationalised fake news story.

Snopes, online fact checking website, have found that although there have been reports of young people committing suicide in Russia over the last six months, of these reported cases <u>none have been found to have had a conclusive tie</u> to the 'Blue Whale'".

### **MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING** – WEBINAR: SUPPORTING TEENS THROUGH DIFFICULT TIMES: TEENAGE BRAIN, EXAM STRESS AND PERFECTIONISM

We are delighted to confirm that we will be hosting a Webinar on **Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2023 at 6.15pm** focused on **'Supporting Teens through difficult times: teenage brain, exam stress and perfectionism'**. All parents and students are invited to attend, but the information is aimed at those in Years 9-13.

The Charlie Waller Trust has been working alongside Dr John Coleman who is a leading expert in the field of teenage brain development. Jenny Langley is one of their lead trainers in this area and in this session, Jenny will talk us through the latest research around the development of the teenage brain, which starts from around the age of 8 and runs through to the mid-twenties. Understanding some of these key changes can help us to see the world through the teenage lens more clearly, and therefore to come alongside our youngsters when they are struggling with pressures such as exam stress, perfectionist tendencies and other social developmental issues. The session will include practical tips in communicating with your teenager in the face of difficulties.

#### STRIKE ACTION – WEDNESDAY 1<sup>ST</sup> FEBRUARY 2023

As you will be aware, members of the National Education Union (NEU), one of the trade unions representing the teaching profession, will take strike action on **Wednesday 1**<sup>st</sup> **February 2023.** The number of teachers from Kendrick School that may take action on that day is 39.

On the basis that the number is a significant proportion of the teaching staff, we feel that it would not be possible to open the school safely to all students. Therefore, the year groups we shall prioritise to be **present at school will be Years 10-13. Years 7-9 will stay at home** however; vulnerable students and key worker children will be able to attend. This has been agreed with our Chair of Governors.

On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February:

- If your child is in Years 10-13 they should attend school as normal that day.
- If your child is in Years 7-9 they should stay at home but will be asked to remotely register at 8.25am, attend online classes if these are available and/or complete work that will be set for them. If you are a critical worker, your child may attend school, however, we must be informed of this by emailing admin@kendrick.reading.sch.uk by Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January at the latest so arrangements can be made. As for Profiling Days, vulnerable students are also able to attend school and our Student Welfare Team (SWT) will make contact with the parents of those students as appropriate.
