### LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

We have completed the first full week of Term 3, and I would like to begin by praising Year 11 students for the Mock examinations they have just completed. Unlike the summer examinations, the mocks are carried out over a very short period with papers and oral exams happening very close together with little time to rest between each session. It is always impressive to see how Year 11 students rise to the challenge and manage this period sensibly and with focus and maturity. Well done to them. The process of giving back papers will begin over the next few weeks which is when the focused learning can continue as the students with their teachers complete the GCSE courses and identify areas for further revision and practice.

Kendrick Parents' Society (KPS) has got off to a flying start with the first meeting of the year on Wednesday. With the new committee in place there was a new look and presentation from them. We received updates on the KPS Wish List Project which was launched in December and will finish in January. A target of £4k was set and £1130 has been raised to buy gifts for the school which will directly benefit the students' learning. So far, the participation of parents has been slow, but we hope with the holiday period behind us, parents will consider a 'New Year' gift for the school. I thank KPS for hosting these sessions. The first drop- in will be with Year 7 parents on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> January between 5.30-6.30pm. Arrangements for a school Disco at Kendrick for Year 7 and 8 students were confirmed which will take place on 8<sup>th</sup> February. This time parents will be able to meet and mingle in the conservatory whilst students are enjoying the disco in the Hall. Finally, an Own Clothes Day was also confirmed for Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January, for £2 donation. Thank you to the KPS committee for the enthusiastic and committed efforts they are putting into supporting our school. If you're worried about any child or young person and you are contacting us out of hours (before 8am and after 4pm and at weekends and holidays), you can contact the NSPCC helpline for support and advice for free - call us on 0808 800 5000 or contact NSPCC online. Children can contact Childline any time to get support themselves. In an emergency please call 999 or for a non-emergency call 101.

#### **NSPCC BETTER SAFE CAMPAIGN**

You may have heard on the radio or seen adverts on the television for NSPCC's, supported by the Home Office, **Better Safe campaign**, which aims to tackle child sex abuse and raise awareness of the Childline helpline.

- New data reveals almost 87,000 sexual offences against children were recorded by police in 2022/23.
- Types of offences included rape, sexual assault, grooming and sexual exploitation.
- Childline is encouraging adults to contact their Helpline if they are concerned a child could be at risk.

This is data is why Childline is launching a new campaign in partnership with the Home Office to tackle child sexual abuse.

Together, they are encouraging adults to <u>contact their Helpline</u> if they are concerned a child could be at risk. The partnership also encourages people to report on instances where there are concerns that a child might be experiencing <u>sexual abuse</u>.

The Home Office is providing funding for the Childline Helpline to increase capacity as well as to raise awareness of their service to the public and professionals.

#### The NSPCC Helpline

The NSPCC Helpline is a free advice line for any adult, including professionals, who has any concerns about a child.

Their dedicated child protection specialists can give advice on a wide range of issues affecting children, as well as when child abuse is suspected. They also operate a dedicated <u>Whistleblowing Helpline</u>, which can be contacted for any concerns around child protection within the workplace, or other professional organisations.

They are encouraging any adult to use the Helpline to express any concerns they might have regarding a child, **even if they're not certain**. By doing this, everyone can play a part in helping keep children safe from sexual abuse.

**FREE SPEECH VS HATE SPEECH** 

Freedom of expression is enshrined in international law. Some individuals, however, misunderstand the right to share their opinions as a license to target others with the most horrendous prejudice. So how do we balance

people's prerogative to have their voice heard against everyone's right to live in a respectful, inclusive society?

This conflict frequently unfolds in the digital world. Online posters can be falsely accused of hate speech, while actual hate is often defended as merely being 'free speech'. To help children and young people learn to identify the boundaries and recognise genuine hate speech when they see it, our #WakeUpWednesday guide provides some helpful definitions and guidelines.

#### "The best way to cheer yourself up is to cheer someone else up" - Mark Twain!

For lots of people, volunteering, or regularly dedicating a specific amount of time to focus purely on another person or cause, can be a useful distraction technique when they are feeling anxious or low. When you know you've helped someone, it can feel really satisfying and remind you of things you are good at which you may have forgotten about. This could be something small like making a cup of tea for a family member or something bigger like starting a new voluntary job. Find what fits your life and makes sense for you.

"Having a purpose is something that can save me when I'm in my darkest moments. I volunteered for a charity for a long time and it was really helpful knowing I was needed somewhere once a week. It reminded me of other things about me apart from just my mental health problems. It was also something I could put on my CV to help me get a job in the future" There are so many different kinds of voluntary roles you can do from helping an elderly person with their iPad, to stroking animals at the local animal rescue centre or putting up posters around your town for people who've gone missing. Find an opportunity local to you on the <u>VInspired</u> website or by visiting your <u>local NCVO volunteer centre</u>. And, if you take care of your family in your spare time or are responsible for caring responsibilities, please get into contact with your local <u>Carers charity</u> and remember you do have rights as a Young Carer, which you can view on the <u>NHS website</u>.

In this <u>video</u>, Young Champion, Sophie, talks about how volunteering, including here at the Centre, helps her manage her mental wellbeing.


