Critiqued in detail by our guest adjudicator **Frank Whately**, former Drama Teacher and Lecturer at Kingston University, who was hugely impressed by all the plays and performances, Cedars was declared this year's winning play and therefore recipients of the impressive shield. Congratulations to them and to all the participants: writers, directors, backstage crew, lighting and sound support and, of course, Mrs Cooper, the House Leaders, Mr Simmonds, Mr Stride and Mr Duncan for their contributions to supporting this super occasion in the school calendar. A feature of all the plays last night was the very good use the students made of the new **lighting system** to enhance dramatic moments in the plays. These lights were purchased by the **raffle funds** raised at last year's **Spring Raffle** by **KPS.** I hope parents and students are able to appreciate that the money raised by KPS goes directly to enhance students' personal development in such a practical and visible way and, as in the case of the plays last night, the lighting gave an even better professional dimension to the overall productions.
