Personally, it has been a pleasure working with this group of students in this last year; they truly are **Leaders** of our school and I am very proud of them. We finished the assembly listening to two beautiful musical items from Arya and Diana and the Senior Choir, followed by some thoughts and reflections of the season.

LIVING WITH COVID

Living with Covid: the end of routine testing in schools, colleges and childcare settings - The Education Hub (blog.gov.uk)

The updated guidance from the DfE is as follows:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days
