Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Such a busy and active week! **The International Women's Day** conference that I attended last week with five students was fantastic. The speakers were inspiring and the workshops engaged the students on issues related to leadership. The students enjoyed the luxury of being in the offices of Ernst & Young in Canary Wharf where they were able to network with other students, as well as the speakers themselves. They have plans to invite some of these people to Kendrick so that more students can share in the ideas and work these women do. A report and photos can be found here. On Friday evening the annual Air Ambulance Concert organised and performed by Kendrick and Reading School took place and I am told that it was an amazing event showcasing musical talent and student leadership in both schools. I hope we will be able to hear a couple of the items played at our Spring Concert at the end of term. The following day on Saturday 8th March students in Year 9 attended the Mock Trail at the Crown Courts. They displayed talent and ability in both their Defence and Prosecution cases and enjoyed the real experience of being in the courtrooms and working with the JPs.

This week has been no less busy. On Monday, a number of our students took part in the **Maestros** organised concert at the **Royal Albert Hall**. Led by Mrs Cooper and accompanied by a few Kendrick staff, a large group of students from across the school left early in the morning and after a day of rehearsals performed in the evening concert as part of a mass choir with many other students from schools across Berkshire. I have spoken to some students who took part in the concert who said the experience was thrilling and was well worth the long and tiring day they had, returning to Reading after midnight. On Wednesday a most special event took place when we welcomed a **Holocaust Survivor** and speaker, **Ruth Barnett**. Ruth was born in 1935 in Berlin when the Nazis were in power. Having a Jewish father meant that her family were not welcome in Germany under the discriminatory racial laws of the Nazis. In February 1939 she and her brother Martin came to England in the Kindertransport where she stayed for 10 years with three different foster families. She was reunited with her parents in 1949 by which time she hardly knew them and could not communicate or relate to them as her parents. As well as telling us her story and the work she now does for the Holocaust Educational Trust, Ruth gave us some important messages which you can read about in the <u>report</u> compiled by our Holocaust Ambassadors, Zakiyyah and Rosie. Ruth has written a number of books both about herself and issues of justice and responsibility. Her talk was engaging and I am pleased that over 150 students, staff, parents and visitors were able to hear her.

Throughout the week there have been a number of **Comic Relief** events led by the Head Girl Team and Sixth Formers and a report about these will follow in due course. No doubt as a school we will raise a lot of money for this very worthy cause.

Once again, from all I have mentioned above, it is clear that the life of a student at Kendrick is rich, varied, meaningful and exciting. I would like to thank all the staff and students who contribute to our wonderfully vibrant and active community life.

2019 KPS Spring Raffle

The KPS Spring Raffle was launched at the start of last week. Sales and donations were counted at the end of last week and approximately 6% of the total had been raised with form 7F being in the lead. A further count is underway

as this weekly update is being published, so do look out for the KPS Raffle update Parentmail at the start of next week to see how much closer we are to our target and who the top 5 forms are!

Proceeds from all raffles and donations go towards equipment and facilities which benefit all the students at Kendrick School. The decision on what proceeds of the raffle/ donations go towards are always discussed and agreed between KPS and the school and these are items which may not otherwise be possible with the continuing reduction in budgets and increased costs. Proceeds from this year's raffle and other donations are going towards the purchase of two trolleys each containing 16 Chromebooks and to provide a contribution to the upgrade of sound, lighting and staging in the main hall. At present there are a limited number of Chromebooks in the school and often the students must share these. These additional 32 Chromebooks will enable greater use of this resource across more lessons and across all year groups. The contribution towards the upgrade to the main hall was requested as these facilities are old and inefficient. The main hall is in constant use for assemblies, house events, presentation evenings, concerts, external speakers and other events, so this upgrade will benefit all students, staff and the community on a daily basis.

Remember there is a fantastic selection of prizes, suitable for both adults and children, with a value of over £1,500.
