I hope everyone enjoyed some rest and relaxation over half term break and has returned to school ready to embark on the second half of the academic year. For our Year 13 students they have been taking mock examinations this week, always a tense time for them, but the work they have put into these will enable them and their teachers to focus on what they need to prepare and complete for the final examinations in the summer. We wish them well.

There are lots of activities to look forward to this term including our Deign Your Future Event for Years 9-12 next week on Thursday 2nd March between 4.00-6.30pm in the school hall. Many employers will be there to talk to students about their chosen careers and professions. We are making a last-minute call to people who may be able to represent their profession at this event, please see item below in the second part of the Weekly Update.

As always at this time of the year there are a lot of planned events for students in school. The Kendrick Student Leaders will be leading an assembly on Monday 27th February on the theme of LGBTQ+ for the whole school and again on Wednesday 8th March they will be highlighting International Women's Day which this year's theme is *Embrace Equity.* The Debate Society is organising an inter-school debate in the afternoon of 8th March from 3.45-5.00pm in the school hall, with students from Reading School. The Kendrick Spring Raffle is being launched next week and students have engaged in making requests about for how some of the money raised should be spent in school. Comic Relief activities take place in the week of 13th March and then on Friday 24th March there is the annual Air Ambulance Concert which this year will be held at Kendrick. The international response at the time was swift and continues to be strong, but few believe there will be a resolution to the situation any time soon. There are memorial services being held across Ukraine and other parts of the world today and the hopes and prayers of everyone remain with the people of Ukraine and those who have and are suffering from this war.

SAFEGUARDING – DANGEROUS DOGS AND SAFEGUARDING

The following information has been taken from a safeguarding update from Andrew Hall, who is a safeguarding professional.

At the beginning of the month, there was the harrowing case of Alice Stones, who was attacked and killed by an outof-control dog at 5pm in her back garden. Normally dogs are our best friends and according to the PDSA there are 10.2 million dog owners in the UK. But sometimes they get out of control, and depending on the breed the outcome can be devastating. Especially to small children who lack the strengths that allow adults to physically defend themselves in these cases. Often dogs that are out of control is due to poor parenting on behalf of the owner, but when you encounter a dog, it is no immediately obvious whether or not they are a danger. For children exploring the world, the tell-tale signs of a poorly trained, or poorly supervised dog are not apparent – they simply don't have the life experience at that point in their early lives to be aware of it. <u>The Dogs Trust</u> has some excellent advice for keeping children safe around dogs. MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING – EAT, SLEEP, BREATHE

Our wellbeing theme this term is "Eat, Sleep, Breathe" and we will be sending students, parents and carers, and staff information throughout the term on why eating well, getting good sleep and relaxation is so important to good mental health and wellbeing.

One way to relax is to take time away from technology. Sometimes technology and social media can be a lifeline but sometimes they can be completely overwhelming and it feels like notifications and messages are never ending.

When we feel like we are constantly attached to everyone and all that is happening in the wider world it can become exhausting. That's one of the reasons why lots of people find time away from social media a really important part of their daily self-care (even if it does feel weird at first!).

"As much as I love my phone and everything I use it for I feel like I'd be much less anxious without it. I have to be really strict with myself sometimes and just turn it off for a bit because I can get kind of addicted".

There are, ironically, <u>a range of apps</u> which can help you manage your use of technology if you feel you spend too much time on social media.

"I find that I sleep better when I stop looking at my phone earlier in the evening"

'It is so easy to get tied down to your phone or other forms of technology. By taking a break and living in the moment, you can find your brain becomes uncluttered and you feel more refreshed.'

'You may think your phone is essential and without it there is nothing to do, but just see how it feels to take yourself away from it for a bit, it doesn't have to be for long but can make a whole lot of difference.'

'I could focus on my direct surroundings, real necessities and have time and enough calm to think and reflect by myself. When connected to technology, I easily get distracted and lose focus and purpose on what I'm doing. Sometimes I even feel like killing time instead of directing it to a purposeful end.'

'It helps as you are able to detox from it - if you can just have some time on your own without friends messaging you or watching a program you can feel more uplifted. Also the accomplishment of not using your phone for a few hours can really make you feel stronger and more able.'

'Go ahead and try it for yourself; think what you use it for and how it impacts your daily activities and relationships. That might help to decide when to disconnect.'

STRIKE ACTION – THURSDAY 2ND MARCH 2023

Members of the National Education Union (NEU), one of the trade unions representing the teaching profession, will take strike action on Thursday 2nd March 2023.
