## **MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING – TEXT MESSAGE SUPPORT**

Some people find text message support easier because it's quicker than writing an email, arranging a phone call or attending a face-to-face appointment. It is also another way of reaching out to friends and family, particularly if this feels easier to you than having a verbal conversation. Although there are mixed opinions on the impact of social media on our mental health, texting can certainly connect you to people from a distance so that you can let them know what you're going through, rather than feeling alone with your thoughts. It's useful to assess how texting makes you feel and only continue using it if you feel it's helping – for example, there shouldn't be any pressure to text someone back right away or talk long into the night if you don't want to, and this can distract from things we need, such as a good amount of sleep.
