Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

I am beginning my message to you this week with a plea about the **Kendrick Parents' Society (KPS) raffle**, our annual fund raising event. We have extended the deadline for the return of stubs/tickets until Monday 1st April so that families are able to sell or return the tickets. We have been speaking to students in their forms, in assembly and via our Head Girl Teams to try to encourage the students to encourage you to sell, donate or return tickets. The KPS committee continue relentlessly in their work to raise money for the school and try to be positive about what they do to help the school and the students. So I ask you again, please can you support KPS to support the school and the learning of your children. At the last count this morning, we have reached 36.9%, (£5530.10) of our target of £15k, with some families selling more tickets than they have been allocated, but clearly some people have not sold any tickets at all. We have just over a week to go, please may I ask you to do what you can to support KPS who on your behalf want to support our school. Without your contributions, super new equipment that will enhance the learning of the students will not be bought. I look forward to your responses. Thank you to the kind donations received so far.

Student activity has continued in school with some very interesting events this week. Led by a group of Sixth Formers, there has been a series of **Ted Talks** with students across the school speaking on a range of subjects from Poverty, Brain implants, Flexitariansim, Climate Change, Identity, Disability Prejudice and many other very interesting topics. I have also attended some excellent assemblies and this week **10H** did an assembly on **Colonialism** which involved them researching the history of colonialism and the impacts, both negative and positive, on our society today.

Outside of school one of our most talented Musicians, <u>Maya Fear, won the Berkshire Young Musician Award</u>, a prestigious award which confirms her as a most promising and gifted musician. We are very proud of Maya. There have been other Music successes at the Henley Music Festival recently and articles and photos will appear on the website in due course.

Please read further into this week's update as there is always a lot of useful information to know. This week there is an important item on **safety** to and from school that all students and parents need to be aware of.

I will finish where I started this week and remind you of the KPS raffle and ask you again to support the school by selling tickets or donating monies to enable us to buy the chrome books and lighting system which will benefit your daughter and our school environment and community.
