## LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

I would like to begin this week's update showcasing the achievements of two of our students: they are <u>Anaya in Year</u> <u>13 who is National Youth Champion in Table Tennis</u> and <u>Adhya in Year 12, who has just won the BBC Young Dancer</u> <u>of the Year 2022</u>. Both of these students are outstanding in their respective fields of Table Tennis and Dance and have been acknowledged to be so by the recent awards they have been given. For both students, these achievements put them in an elite class of competitors and demonstrates their incredible talent and hard work. They deserve huge congratulations and our very best wishes for the future.

This week we have celebrated with **Year 11 and Year13** their last day in school before they embark on their public examination next week. Both cohorts have had assemblies where they have reflected on their years at Kendrick and reminisced about their times at school with their friends, teachers and staff. Occurring through messaging apps, on social media and in online games, group chats are among the most popular ways that young people engage with their peers online. Involving, by definition, three or more individuals, these groups allow users to send messages, images and videos to everyone in one place. While they are useful for helping friends, people with shared interests or members of a club to communicate and coordinate activities, they can also leave young people feeling excluded and bullied – as well as providing opportunities for inappropriate content to be shared and viewed.

# COVID Update

#### Vaccinations

The School Nursing Team has informed us that vaccinations will not be carried out at school. If your child has had only one vaccination, you will need to book an appointment at a Vaccination Centre through the NHS website.

#### **COVID Symptoms – latest government advice**

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.
