This morning we had a whole school assembly when I introduced the new **Kendrick Student Leadership Team** to the school. It is the time of year when the new team takes over and begins to plan what they would like to do in the coming year. The students spoke confidently about their plans for the future. Bullying is behaviour that hurts someone else. It includes name calling, hitting, pushing, spreading rumours, threatening or undermining someone.

It can happen anywhere – at school, at home or online. It's usually repeated over a long period of time and can hurt a child both physically and emotionally.

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place online. Unlike bullying offline, online bullying can follow the child wherever they go, via social networks, gaming and mobile phone.
