# LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Welcome back to Term 5, I hope everyone has had a restful spring break and feels refreshed for the term ahead.

It has been a busy start to the term with AS Mock exams for Sixth Form students on Monday. In addition, we returned to some significant adjustments to our premises in main school. Over the holiday almost all the doors, including fire doors of the main school block, were changed and upgraded to make them appropriately compliant with the requirements of fire regulations. This was a huge project which cost almost £300k and was financed by a bid we applied for to the government called Capital Improvement Fund (CIF). We have been successful in our applications for such funding over the last few years, but this project has been super quick in securing and implementing. I am always very pleased and encouraged when we can make such improvements to the condition and fabric of the school. The Cedars project was the previous successful CIF bid we made which resulted in new windows and a roof of that building costing around £370k.

Today we started the day with a whole school assembly at which I introduced the new Kendrick School Leaders 2024-25 to the school. This is a most important time in our school year when one team of student leaders takes over from the previous team. This year the team is made up 18 students, three students in each of the three committees and three students in each of the three Houses. They presented themselves to the school and spoke a little about their plans for the year ahead. They showed confidence and a real desire to support their school and fellow students in the plans they have for the coming year. You will hear more about them and from them in due course.

The Kendrick Student Leaders will begin their term of office by representing the school at our Open Day sessions next week. The Open Days now occur in the school day when groups of parents and students are given a tour by students and then receive information about the school from me, the Kendrick Student Leaders and some Year 7 students. SELF-CARE – RELAXATION TECHNIQUES SOURCE: ANNA FREUD

There are lots of different kinds of relaxation techniques that you can try out. Lots of people find these helpful particularly when they are feeling overwhelmed, stressed or anxious. Relaxation techniques are also often recommended in a lot of therapies.

A few different types of relaxation techniques are:

- Slowing down your breathing
- Progressive Muscle Relaxation
- Guided Visualisation
- Repeating Mantras to yourself (e.g I can handle whatever comes my way)

'Relaxation is a big one I use when I notice my thoughts speeding up...I try to just go with it and see what happens, not being too bothered about the small things or if I feel self-conscious.'

There are a range of <u>relaxation apps</u> which you may wish to try which you can find including the free <u>NHS Chill</u> <u>Panda</u> app.
