Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Welcome back to school. I hope everyone has had a good and restful holiday and was able to enjoy the lovely sunny days of the Easter weekend. I would like to thank everyone for their work and efforts last term and, in particular, commend our talented musicians and staff for the excellent concert we had last term. Last night we held our Open Day for prospective students and parents for September 2020 entry. As always the event was very popular and hundreds of people visited Kendrick and were politely taken around our school by our students who spoke proudly and confidently about their school. Thank you to them and all the staff involved last night in preparing and running the event. The September 2020 entry is when we will be able to take an expanded cohort of 32 students making the new Year 7 a total of 128 students. We are very excited about these developments, not least because we are going out to local schools and working with teachers and students to encourage them to consider Kendrick as a possible choice for their secondary education. Our own students are participating in this work and I am so proud and pleased with their enthusiasm to do so.

I am delighted to announce to you our new Head Girl Team (HGT) for 2019-20. They started planning and training for their roles before the end of term and proudly introduced themselves to the school at the first whole school assembly on Tuesday. Their message to the school was that they wish to 'empower themselves, empower others and empower their community'. They have already made a brilliant first impression and Louise and Serena spoke beautifully at Open Day last night whilst the rest of the team coordinated operations, managing the vast crowds that visited the school. He also commended us on having a score of 97% for the EBacc qualification. Spring Raffle – 2019

The KPS Spring Raffle was drawn on the 4th April during the Spring Concert. The evening was a great success on many levels and the generosity of family and friends resulted in us exceeding £10,000 by the end of the evening, with over

£500 being raised with donations and raffle ticket sales on that one day! We are pleased to confirm that we were able to collect 67% of our target with the exact total of **£10,043.16**. We have decided to keep the online donation site open until the end of April 2019, also we are expecting a matched funding donation courtesy of 3 volunteers and their employer Thames Water, as well as further proceeds from the gift aid donations. We are hoping that we should be able to achieve our target of £15,000 by the end of this month. We will provide the final breakdown and total collections in our May month newsletter.

International Food Festival - 2019

Our next event is a first of its kind within the Kendrick School community and is an innovative attempt to celebrate and leverage the variety and diversity of our school community.
