Letter from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

A few weeks ago I mentioned the Period Poverty campaign that some of our 6th Form students initiated and the many sanitary boxes we were able to give to two local charities, Red Box and Sadaka. Some students in Year 9 have asked me to mention a theatre production they are involved in called 'When They Go Low', from the 2018 National Theatre Connections Folio. It is, in their words, 'a punchy modern feminist tale set in a British Secondary School where a website has recently sprung up rating all the female students out of 10. Based on a real story, this show is a fast-paced, magnetic pull through the lens of modern British Teen life, and a stark reminder of some of the challenges they still face. As we approach the last few weeks of term there are lots of what I would describe as 'beginning' and 'ending' events taking place. On Monday a few staff joined our out-going Year 13 at their wonderful end of year prom. Honoured to be invited, we saw them with their friends and partners looking relaxed now that the exams have finished, but so grown up and sophisticated in their beautiful prom outfits which suited the occasion marking the end of their school life. Personally I feel a huge sense of pride and satisfaction seeing our young people get to this point in their education, knowing that everyone has done as much as they can to help them on their journey in life and on to the next stage. At the other end of the scale, last night we welcomed our prospective Year 7 students and their parents/carers to the Information Evening. Although quite different to the prom event, it is just as exciting and equally filled with ambition and hope. It is lovely to see young children making friends, asking questions and generally eager and enthusiastic to take their next step in life, unaware of the huge significance of the moment. It reinforces for me the great privilege it is to work with young people in these formative years of their life.

Our inset day today is a welcome opportunity for the staff to spend time on their professional development. Teachers spent the first part of the day looking at the new Ofsted framework which becomes effective in September 2019. While we remain exempt from regular inspections under the current rules, it is vital that we continue to be aware and work on what Ofsted consider to be priorities in their judgments of schools. The emphasis in the new framework is on the **quality of education** which we all agree is an essential priority, as are the other top priorities: **behaviour and attitudes**, **personal development** and **leadership and management**. These elements feature in how we have structured our school development plan for next year and going forward I would like to keep parents/carers and students informed of what our key developments are for the school over the next 1-5 years. Starting in September, I will regularly refer to our Kendrick School Development Plan in my Weekly Update.

I hope the students have enjoyed their day off school today. Many of them have some exciting events to look forward to next week. Year 10, who ran a super charity week this week, will be embarking on their five day work experience and a large number of students in Year 12 will be going on their field trip, an essential component of their A Level Biology course.

Finally, please remember that the KPS Food Festival is just over a week away and students in school have been asked to get involved in running games or baking a cake for the cake competition. Sports Day

Sports Day will take place at Palmer Park Sports Stadium on Thursday 11th July 2019 between 10.00am and 3.00pm.

The arrangements for the day are as follows:

- Students involved in Field Events will walk to Palmer Park at 9.00am accompanied by members of staff.
- All other students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 will have their usual lessons until 10.55am and then after a short break, will walk to Palmer Park, accompanied by their form tutor. Students will be fully supervised on the journey and tutors will be assisted by other members of staff and Year 12 students.
