# WEEKLY LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

At last we are at the end of term and at the end of a **most extraordinary year**. I would like to say once again how proud I am of our school community in the last few months as we have transformed ourselves into a **remote learning community**. Thank you to you all for your perseverance and forbearance in these very difficult times. Thank you also for your trust and understanding, as well the appreciation expressed in emails I have received recently about how well Kendrick School has served its community. Such support and encouragement helps us all and is greatly appreciated.

Yesterday I sent you a **letter** and a document called **Executive Summary** outlining how we intend to **return to school in September**. All this information is on the website <u>HERE</u> and more will be added as we draw up more detailed guidance for the whole school community. As I said in my letter, there are many people who are very anxious about the return to school in September, but I want to assure everyone that we are doing all that we can to make everyone safe. September will be a change for everyone and I know that some families have not ventured out from their homes for these last few months, fearful of the outside world and threat of the virus, especially groups in the BAME community or those in high risk categories. This is understandable, but I would like to suggest that if people feel like this, perhaps they could try to take small steps outside their homes to begin to familiarise themselves with routines they will need to follow in September. Many of our students do not live close to our school and have not done the journey for several months, perhaps trying the journey during the summer holiday might be helpful.

I am also aware that in some families there are people who have had the virus and also families where they may have lost a loved one. If this is the case and you feel we need to know more about your individual circumstances, please let us know so that we can support you where we can. Our twice weekly email contact from the TLC to students and parents and the gentle conversations, including sessions with tutors last week during profiling, some information about how families have fared has come through to us. If anyone feels they need to **share more information in confidence**, please do so if you feel it will help us to help you, as we prepare for the return to school in September.

There is still some lovely news to share with you this week. Firstly thank you to everyone for buying raffle tickets which enabled **KPS to raise over £7k** from the Spring Raffle, we are delighted with this result! There are many new articles on the website this week which I suggest you look at: <u>Statue Challenge Entries</u>, <u>Online performer Series 3</u>, 40 minutes of inspiration provided by our students and staff. Also the KSLT requested photos of the **Pebbles Pride Project** and there are some super examples of these <u>here</u>. <u>Sports Day</u> took place on Monday and the feedback I have received is that it went well. I enjoyed watching the staff do their **fitness session** on the front lawn from my office window, which looked exhausting! Thank you to **Ms Watkins and the PE Department**. Also on the website is a news item about our school being named as <u>best state funded school in Reading and Berkshire</u>. Thank you to everyone for enabling us to have such an accolade which we do not take for granted.

We have some staff leaving this year: Ms Stacey, Head of 6<sup>th</sup> Form, Frau Alderson, Subject Leader for German, Mr Hiner – PD Lead Teacher, Ms Fallows English Teacher and Second in the Department, Mrs Haldane Maths Teacher, Mr Smith Physics Teacher. All of these people have made a significant contribution and will be hugely missed by us all. We wish them well and every success in the new pursuits and careers that they each plan to do. Today is the last day of term and by the time you receive this weekly update, we will have had a **whole school assembly.** The assembly took place in the **School Hall**, I was behind the lectern and a lot of staff sat in front of me. Absent in person was the student body who were invited to join us remotely and I do hope they all attended, including **Year 11 and Year 13 students**. It may be that parents joined us to hear our end of term messages and reflections on this extraordinary year.
