WEEKLY LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

I will start as I did last week by thanking everyone who responded to our last minute call to buy raffle tickets for the KPS Spring raffle which is being drawn at 2.00pm today. By the time you receive this message there will be a few happy people who have won some of the fabulous prizes on offer. The last update which I received yesterday suggests that the money raised has exceeded £6k which is brilliant! As we approach the end of term, I have been reflecting on the events of the last few months and cannot believe the transformation we have undertaken since March. Again I would like to thank the staff, students, parents and governors for everyone's efforts to carry on despite a worldwide pandemic and lockdown and still deliver a first class education to our students. We could have abandoned so much of what takes place in our calendar, but through determination and commitment, everyone has pulled together to enable our school to carry on and continue to deliver an education for our students. I have tried to mention as much as I am aware of what has been going on remotely in these weekly updates to you and I hope that you have appreciated hearing of the work and activities that have taken place and have felt reassured that the students' learning has continued and so much more. This week has been as active as any other. Profiling, one to one conversations with students with their subject teachers and tutors, have been going on and these will inform reports which will be sent to parents and students. For Year 12, this week has been Futures Week, where the sixth form team have focused on giving information and guidance to students about their future plans. An online session took place last night where Ms Stacey and her team spoke to parents and students under the heading 'Life after Kendrick' about university entrance and the process of UCAS, personal statements (an essential part of the UCAS application), as well as, a webinar on student finance. These sessions will help students begin their research into courses/university they wish to pursue post A Level studies and help them in their application process which begins in September when we return to school.

We received the **government guidance for the reopening of schools** at the end of last week and have been preparing our own school guidance which we will begin by sharing with staff and then communicating to parents and students next week. Whilst there is huge excitement about returning to school, I know there is also great anxiety amongst parents about their children returning to school after being in lockdown and protected for the last few months. I want to reassure parents, staff and students that we will adhere to the guidance in all matters and through careful planning, including cohorts being kept separated and in bubbles, enhanced hygiene and cleaning protocols and many other procedures, we will endeavour to keep the staff and students safe and well.

Year 10 and 12 students and parents may have been following the suggestions about how examinations will be managed next summer. **OFQUAL, The Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation** has prepared a consultation document about proposals for next year's public examinations. There are a number of proposals of a general nature, as well as specific proposals for certain subjects. The proposals recognise that students' education and courses at GCSE and A Level have been disrupted by the COVID pandemic. The consultation document is <u>HERE</u> and the closing date for responses is 11.45pm on **Thursday 16th July**. If students and or parents wish to comment they may do so by completing the online response link found on page 5 of the document.

Many commentators and educationalist are suggesting that as we prepare for the reopening of schools we should review all our old routines and norms and take the **opportunity to rethink how we do things in the future**. I am completely in favour of this approach and will be suggesting to staff and students some new ways in which we can do things. For example how we conduct Information Evenings, Parent Consultation meetings, Governor Meetings etc. The emerging new normal will not be like things used to be and I hope that our forced response to working practices in lockdown has skilled us to be able to develop new effective and smarter approaches to our work.

I promised **Lily in Year 12** that I would mention the planning of an **online Air Ambulance concert**. Our annual concert to raise funds for Air Ambulance was cancelled because of the COVID pandemic and Lily and her counterpart at Reading School wish to organise a virtual concert and to raise money for the Thames Valley Air Ambulance, particularly as they were one of the first responders to the tragic events in **Forbury Gardens** a couple of weeks ago. I hope students will support this initiative for this very worthy cause. Finally, a couple of items on our website include an article by **Frau Mueller**, **Tutor of 7T**, who asked her Form to **reflect on the strength of our school community** following the events in Forbury Gardens and the death of three innocent people. She asked the students to draw a lion and decorate it as they wished. At a live Google meet session the students shared their lions. The article and an example drawn by **Koyenum in 7T** of a particularly fearsome lion standing on a plinth that has on it our Kendrick Pledge, is a super example of the work done. See <u>LINK</u> to website. The lion is wearing a sash on which it says 'Justice for All', the last few words of our Kendrick Pledge. Another great article on our website is work done by **Year 8 and 9 students in PHCSE**, initiated by **Mrs Lace Head of PSHCE** and **Miss Swaine**, **TLC for Years 8 and 9**, following the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis at the end of May. Students were asked to reflect on the Kendrick Pledge by creating an A5 poster, please see LINK to see some of the beautiful examples of students' work.
