## Kendrick School Curriculum Model



Years 7-9
Year 7 students have a Food lesson, a Textiles lesson and a Technology lesson once a fortnight throughout the whole year
Year 8 students have Food and Textiles lessons once a week for the whole of the year. They also have a Technology lesson once a fortnight
Year 9 students have Food and Textiles lessons once a fortnight for the whole of the year
In Year 8, the language studied in Year 7 becomes the students L1 and they take up the other language as L2

## Years 10 and Year 11

All students have the opportunity to study 11 GCSE subjects: English Literature, English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and 5 options
Current GCSE Options are: Art and Design, Art and Design - Textile Design, Business, Computer Science, Drama, Food Preparation and Nutrition, French, Geography, German, History, Latin, Music,
Physical Education (PE) and Religious Studies (RS)
All students must opt for one language (French or German) and one humanity (Geography or History or RS). They can take an additional language and/or Humanity subject as they wish
Students are offered free choice in their subject combination and the timetable and blocks are constructed based on those choices.
Years 12 and Year 13
3 or 4 A Level programs are possible for Year 12 students with the option of taking 1 AS at the end of Year 12, if available, for those students on the 4 A Level program.
Studying 3 A Level courses is standard for year 13 students. Some students opt to take 4 A Level Subjects
The GCE Options offered, subject to numbers, are Art and Design, Biology, Chemistry, Classical Civilisation, Computer Science, Drama and Theatre Studies, Economics, English Literature, French, Geography, German, History, Latin, Mathemat Further Mathematics, Music, PE, Physics, Philosophy and Ethics, Spanish and Sociology
For 2023-2024, Drama and Theatre Studies and Latin are not available in Year 12: Drama and Theatre Studies and Spanish are not available in Year 13
Students are offered free choice in their subject combination and the timetable and blocks are constructed based on those choices.
DSP = Directed Independent Study period for years 12 and 13. Each subject has 8 taught lessons and 2 DSPs per 2 week cycle except year 12 Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics which have 9 taught lessons and 1 DSP. Some subects run support sessions in some of the DSP slots
ASFM - AS Further Maths is an optional course for any Mathematics student. Students who do not opt for this have Private Study in this time
EPQ= the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is offered in term 4 of Year 12 and runs through year 13. Students who do not opt for this have Private Study in this time.
$\mathrm{PR}=$ Physical Recreation
