



Admission to Year 7 in September 2019 National Offer Day - Frequently Asked Questions

Q	My daughter has been offered a place - when will I hear from Kendrick School?
A	If your daughter has been offered a place at Kendrick School you will receive an email from us on 4 th March 2019. If you do not receive this email by 8 th March please check your spam/junk folders before contacting admissions@kendrick.reading.sch.uk .
Q	How will I know if my daughter is on the waiting list and what her position is?
A	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If your daughter's score is 107.00 or above she will be on our waiting list unless you have been offered a place at your higher preference school or you did not put Kendrick School on your CAF. • The waiting list consists of the ranked order of candidates (adjusted for those living within the designated area) with scores of 107.00 and above who have not been offered a place at Kendrick School. • As at 1st March 2019, there are 120 candidates on the waiting list and the highest score on the waiting list is 114.71 (within designated area at time of registration). • If your daughter is on the waiting list, you will receive an email from us giving her position as at 1st March 2019, during the week commencing 4th March 2019. If you have not received this email by the end of this week, please check your spam/junk folders before emailing admissions@kendrick.reading.sch.uk. Please do not contact the school before this time.
Q	My daughter scored above 107.00 but has not been offered a place. Why?
A	This is because the 96 places have been offered to the highest scoring candidates and ranked according to our oversubscription criteria. Your daughter may have been placed on our waiting list (please see the question above).
Q	My daughter scored over 107.00 and has not been offered a place or been placed on your waiting list. Why?
A	This is likely to be because your Local Authority has been able to offer you a place at the school that you indicated as a higher preference.
Q	Can I change my preference and put Kendrick first?
A	Please contact your own Local Authority.
Q	Can my daughter's position on the waiting list change?
A	Your daughter's position on the waiting list may go up or down due to change of preference, offers and/or withdrawals.
Q	Can papers be remarked?
A	All the entrance tests are double scanned and checked using different optical mark readers and different staff. The process is reliable and trustworthy and as a result re-marks would be unnecessary. The likelihood of any mistake being made in recording the correct test responses from the multiple choice answer sheet is negligible. However, if you do wish to have your daughter's papers re-marked, the cost of a re-mark would be £50 per paper. Please send an email to admissions@kendrick.reading.sch.uk or letter addressed to the Admissions Officer with your daughter's full name, date of birth and candidate number outlining your request for a re-mark. A remark will not give any other information other than confirmation of the standardised score.

Q	Can I appeal?
