









NUREMBERG LAWS MID-SEPTEMBER, 1935



Jews (and other groups) lost their German citizenshipbecame 'subjects of the German Empire'

Marriage and sexual relations between Jews and non-Jews were forbidden

Non Jewish German women (Aryans) under the age of 45 are not allowed to work for Jews

THE NAZIS DEFINED AS JEWISH

Anyone with 3 or more Jewish grandparents were defined as fully Jewish

Those with less than 3 were still affected by anti-Jewish legislation although not to the same extent
















