

Normal People is a story of mutual fascination, friendship and love. It takes us from that first conversation to the years beyond, in the company of two people who try to stay apart but find they can't.




What are you reading?

What is Ms. Kattirtzi reading?




Ms. Kattirtzi is an avid reader who has recently had 'lockdown birthday' and received some lovely books as gifts. book she The reading at the moment is called 100 Letters that changed the World by Colin Salter.

It is a collection of the most inspiring and



powerful letters of all time. The written word has the power to inspire, astonish and entertain, as this collection of 100 letters that changed history will show. Ordered chronologically, the letters range from ink-inscribed tablets that vividly describe life in the Roman Empire to remarkable last wills and testaments, passionate outpourings of love and despair, and succinct notes with deadly consequences. The final letter brings us right up to date with a letter from Greta Thunberg to the Indian Prime Minister.

Ms. Kattirtzi tells us, 'One of the letters which really touched me was that of Sullivan Ballou an East Coast Lawyer at the time of the American Civil War. His letter was written on the eve of battle, to his wife Sarah on 14 July 1861. I was deeply moved by the contradiction that Sullivan Ballou felt between fighting out of conviction and love for his country but knowing that it would likely mean his death and parting from his beloved wife and family. He wanted Sarah to know how deeply he felt for her and that if he died, her name would be on his lips.'






In other news...
